The group skied 'through the clouds' in the mountains, visiting



Recommend curtew

PICKERING - If the bylaw remains unchanged, a curfew will limit the night-time hours of operation for snowmobiles in Pickering Township. South of the Macdonald-Cartier Freeway, the ban extends from 10 p.m. to 8 a.m. and north of the Freeway, from 12:30 a.m. to 8

The bylaw also prohibits the machines on township road allowances, except where crossing roads at perpendicular angles; prohibits them on sidewalks and on private properties without the owner's

permission.

Owners and nonowners were out in force at the meeting, each group expressing opinions pro, and con. The interruptions became so frequent that reeve / John Williams finally cleared the gallery.

Planning director John Faulkner speaking as a private citizen, said council should not concern itself with snowmobiles on township-roads. With respect to noise, he

said they were not as bothersome as farm grain-dryers, trucks, tractors or motor-

cycles. Mr. Umphrey, a resident near Brougham, said snowmobiles made no more noise than gravel trucks on the Brock


