Father must support family

MARKHAM - Although all visitation rights are cut off for three months and his common-law wife

retains custody of the three children, Ivan Spencer must provide support for the family, Judge Russell Pearce

ruled Richmond Hill Court today.
 Fisher, Mr. Spencer must refrain from keeping a weapon of any kind and bound over to keep the peace for a period of one year.

According to evidence, the accused returned home on the night of Jan. 3 and threatened his wife, Rena with a pipe and a knife. He admitted striking her and she feared him and

had since moved away, taking the children with her.
 Lawyer John Lawlor told the Court that the father was now utilizing a counselling service provided by the Markham Family Life Centre. He said Mr. Spencer was willing to stay away from his wife but didn't wish to see the door closed in case his condition improved.

In suspending sentence, Judge Pearce warned the accused of the seriousness of the crime and the penalty that could be imposed if he should appear again on a similar charge.
