

**Planned V.L.A. development**

**Ballantrae — A more prominent dot**

BALLANTRAE - If Clayton Clouter's proposed V.L.A. development proceeds according to his plans, the hamlet of Ballantrae could become a much more prominent dot on the map of Whitchurch-Stouffville.

The subdivision, containing 57 lots, has been named 'Estates of Ballantrae'. The location is part of the

former Herbert Simpson farm with an exit and entrance from both Hwy. 48 and the Aurora Road. One commercial block has been set aside for several small service stores and perhaps a service station. Seven acres has been donated for a park and recreation area.

The first basements will be excavated in mid-March, Mr. Clouter said. So far, nine sales have been completed with others pending.

"There's no selling job involved," he said, "the homes sell themselves. Prices range from \$28,000 to \$38,000."

Subdivision services include - paved roads, underground wiring, electric heat and street lights. "We're not

losing and we're not making a killing. We're dealing with a specific group - veterans," he continued.

Mr. Clouter first approached the then, Whitchurch Twp. Council and Planning Board back in Oct. 1968. Negotiations continued through 1969 before any definite decision was reached.

Mr. Clouter said the type of homes offered and their location seemed to appeal to the veteran whose family is now almost grown up and through

school. "They feel they want to get out of Metro and live in the country. For them, the purchase price and the location is perfect."

But all applications must meet V.L.A. conditions. This means the cash difference between the total cost and the \$15,400 V.L.A. mortgage.

If buyer interest and enthusiasm means anything, the development is assured of success. In a single day, more than 40 couples visited the site.
