Ringwood Public School Locate old register

RINGWOOD - An old student enrollment record, dating back to the years 1881 and 1883, has been found among files at the Ringwood Public School.

While somewhat tattered and yellow with age, the names of many of the pupils are still legible. Teachers of that day were Reuben Harrington and Hartman Jones.

Button; Addie Mertens, Priscilla Pipher, Bristol Wideman, Martha, Wilnot and Alice Pike; Minnie Song, Daniel, Lucy, Robert, John, Mary and Elizabeth Windsor.

At least four of the children still attending at Ringwood retain a family relationship with some of the pupils of 89 years ago.
