Breaks 300 barrier

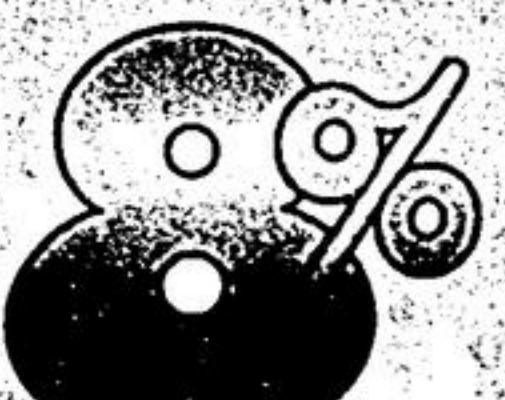
