The bride, given in marriage by her father, was attired in a delightful old Victorian style gown of white satin and French

net. She carried American Beauty red roses with white lilies. Mrs. Harold Murphy, sister of the bride and matron of honor, wore pale pink net dress point d'exprit with a nosegay of Forget-me-nots and tea roses. Mrs. Gordon Baker was the pianist.

May and Annie Barkey live in a man-made haven for winter birds. They say it is a pleasant and rewarding hobby to feed these hungry creatures and help them through the lean months.

The hobby, however, has become a full-time job with enormous responsibility. Word has spread that the feeders are well stocked with everyone's favorite gourmet delight from peanut hearts to suet puddings. Whether it be a mourning dove or a chickadee, there is enough for all.

May and Annie have identified 75 different species at their feeders. Cardinals, blue jays, juncos, pheasants and wax wings gather by the hundreds and the feed is rapidly climbing to the thousand pound mark. A note of thanks for this very special service.
