

Impaired charge dismissed

GORMLEY - A 22 year old Gormley man was acquitted on a charge of impaired driving in Richmond Hill Court Tuesday morning after Judge R.G. Pearse found there was lack of evidence to convict him.

Police testified that Morris Brash of R.R. 1, Gormley was found asleep in his pickup truck in the parking lot of a service station on the corner of Don Mills and the Stouffville Side Road.

Detective Robert Hadden of the York Regional Police Markham Township Division told the court he found the accused slumped over the wheel of his vehicle on the driver's side.

He described the accused as "flushed and glassy-eyed" and unable to walk properly without help. Continuing his testimony, Detective Hadden said Brash was unable to perform any of the tests they asked him to without falling.

When Brash took the witness stand he told the court that he was at a friend's party with his nephew the night he was arrested.

He testified that he had left "pretty high" but that his 17 year old nephew was driving. In handing down his acquittal, Judge Pearse said there "was no doubt in his mind" that the accused was intoxicated at the time of his arrest but that there was a lack of evidence to convict him of "driving" while impaired.
