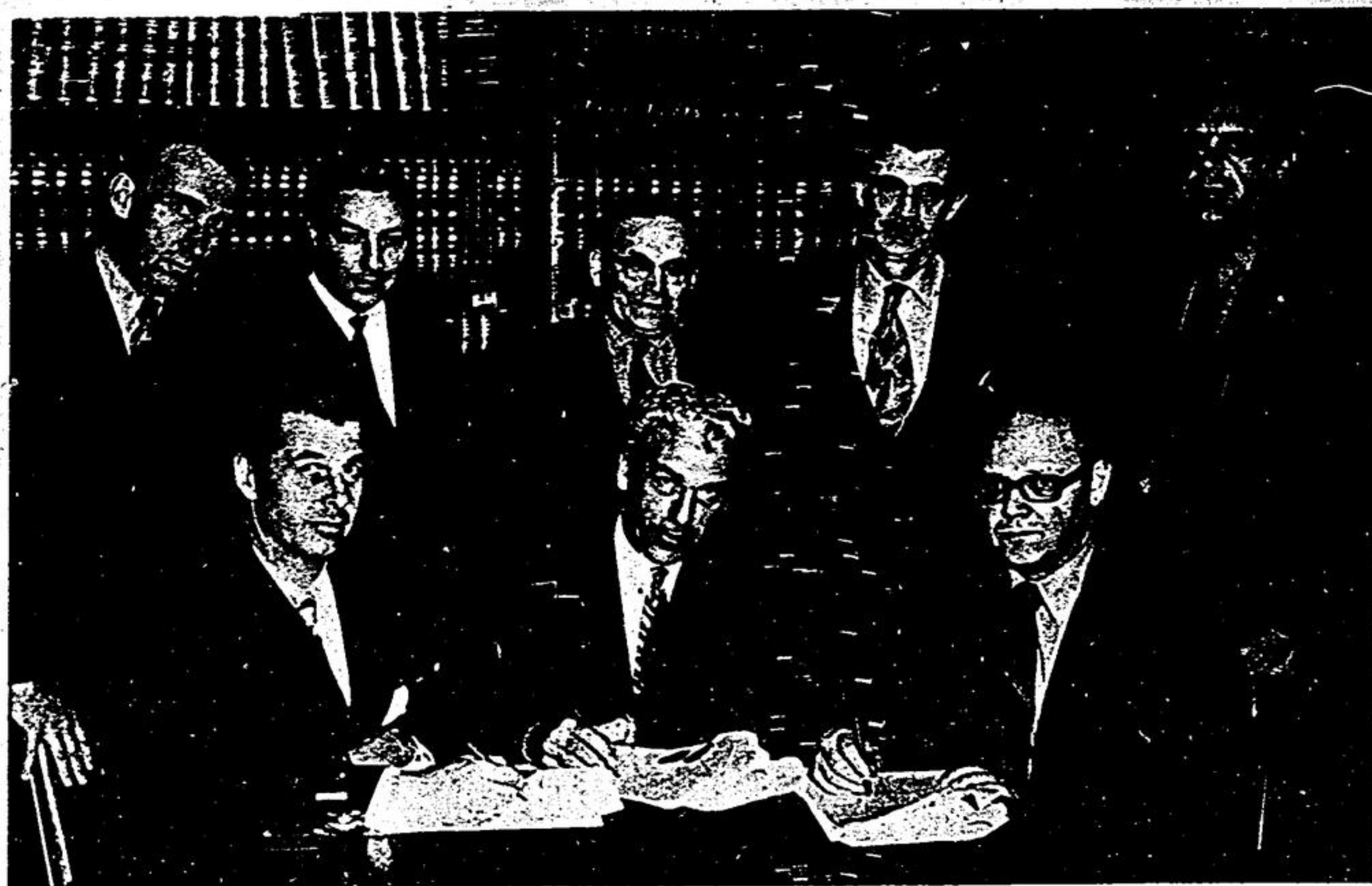

Mrs. Dorothy Middleton attended the Red Cross luncheon at the home of Mr. and

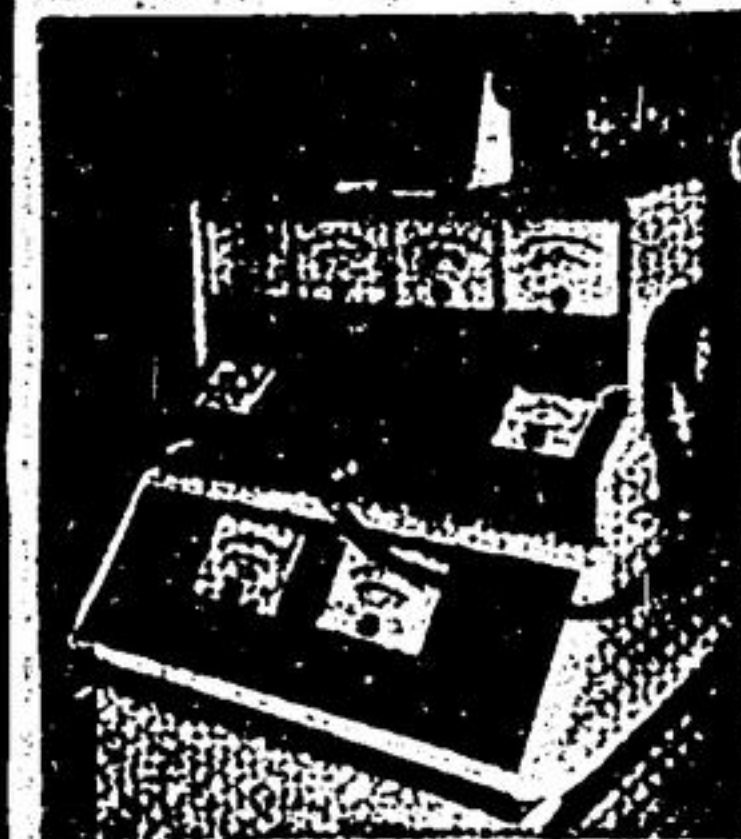
