Stouffville United Church Budget - \$33,000

STOUFFVILLE - Envelope offerings totalled \$18,201.00 in 1970, the financial report of the Stouffville United Church revealed. This is an increase of \$696.55 over the previous year.

In addition, loose offering amounted to \$1,476.28. An outline of activities from all departments of the church, indicated many projects and programs had been undertaken and successfully completed.

The pastor is Rev. Jas. Carder. Membership to Dec. 31, 1970 included 383 resident and 29 non-resident for a total of 354. Seventeen new members were received, 7 by profession of faith and 10 by transfer.

There were 17 baptisms, 25 weddings and 10 funerals.

One report of interest was presented by the Couples Club. Receipts from the two-night show 'Music Mania' amounted to \$2,914.73. When all expenses were paid, a donation of \$1,150.00 was made to the Stouffville Parks and Recreation Committee.

The proposed church budget for 1971, as set out in the report, is \$33,026.00.
