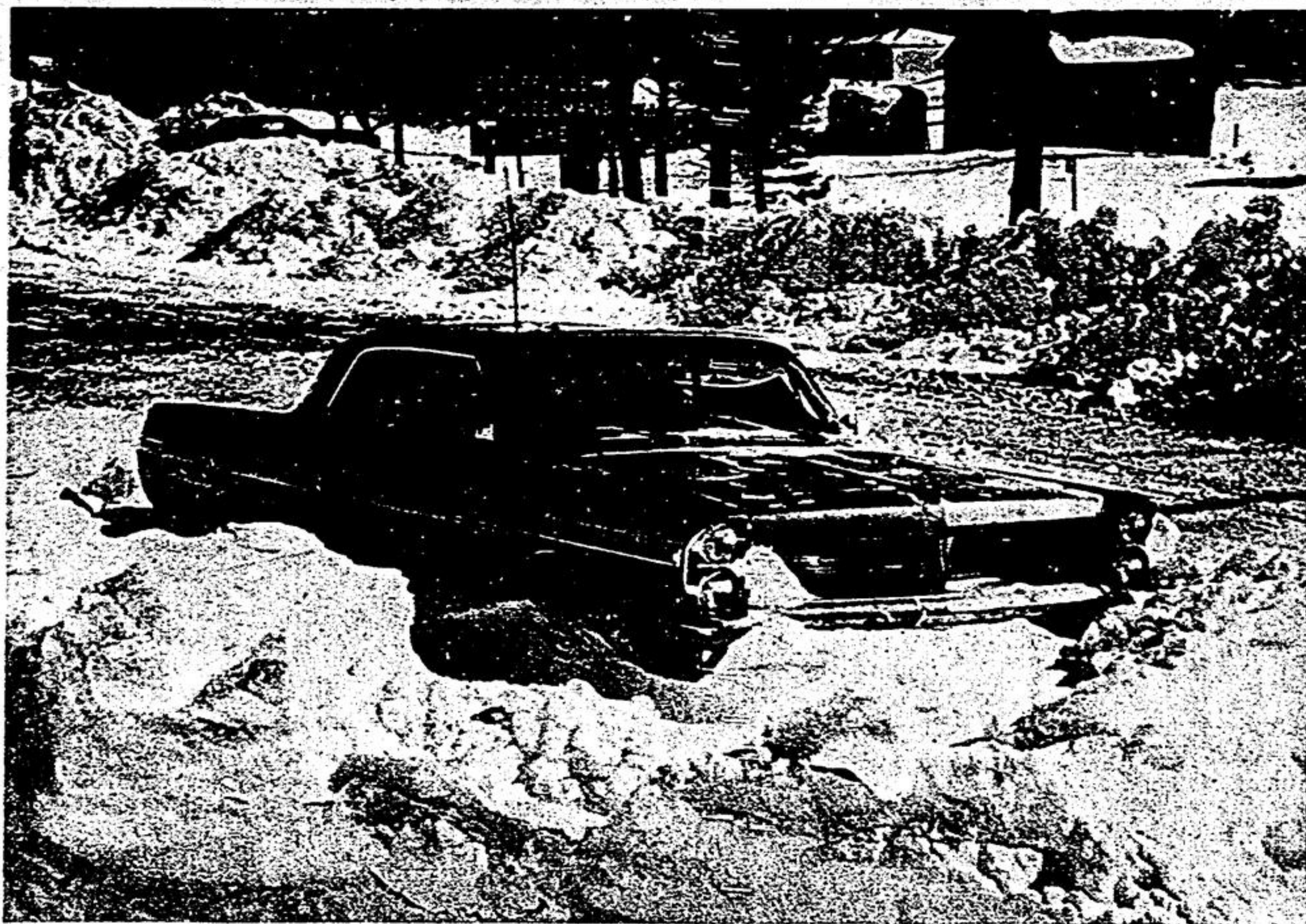


Around the world

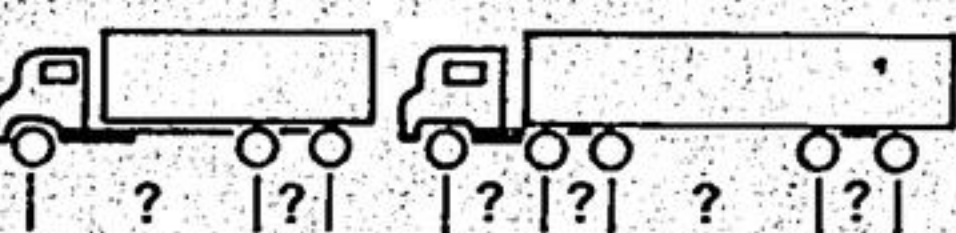
