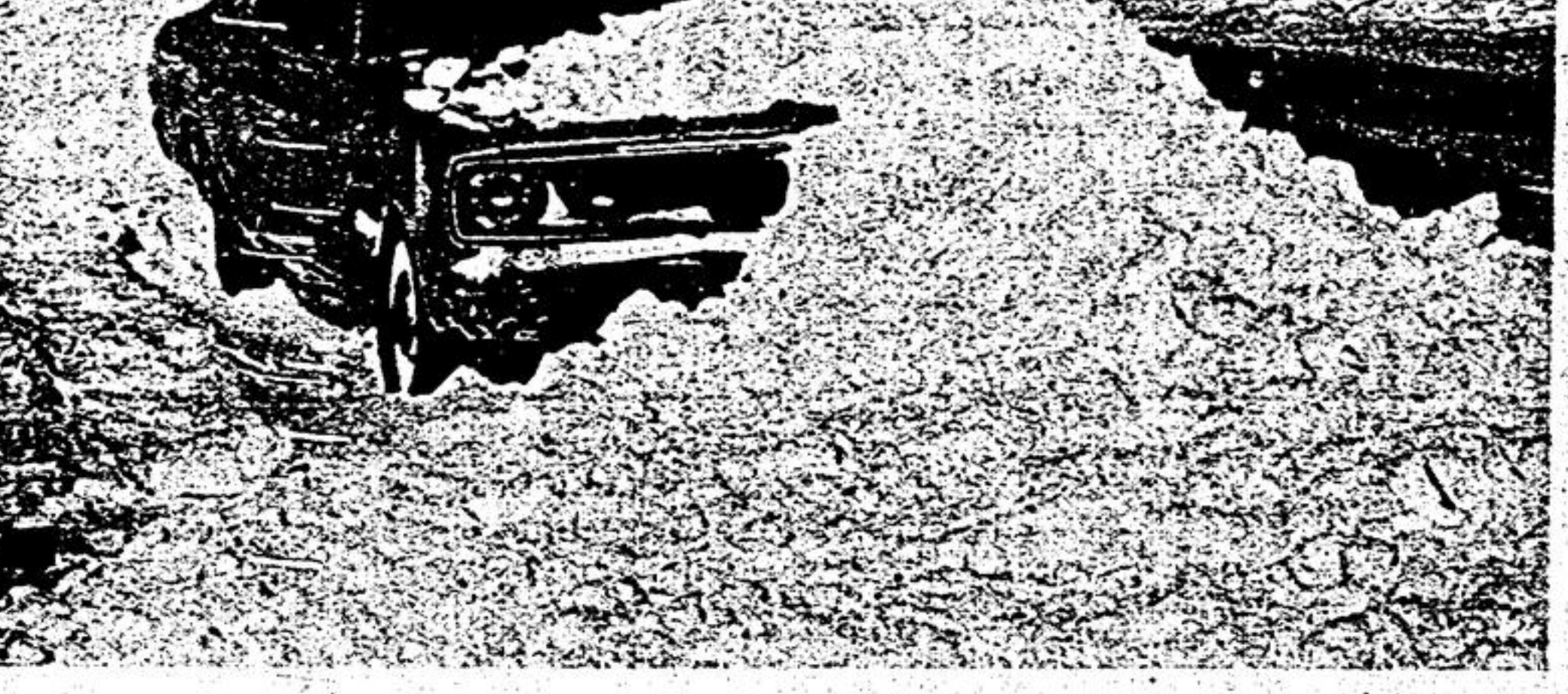

Late Aljean Chapman

Wife of famous film maker

 Aljean (Pert) Chapman died on Saturday, February 13, at her home in Cedar Grove following a long illness. She was the wife of film maker Christopher Chapman and mother of Julian, seven years old.

Mr. and Mrs. Chapman have lived in Cedar Grove since their marriage 11 years ago and Aljean earned love and respect as a thoughtful and generous neighbour and friend.

Born in Glasgow, Scotland, she arrived in Canada on Christmas Eve 1947 and leaves her mother, Mrs. Jane McNeil, a brother Jack Pert and a sister Isobel Colville still living in Scotland. Three sisters, Margaret, Gracie, Mary Mathis and Nancy Morrison and one brother George Pert, lives in Scarborough. Maybe there is too
