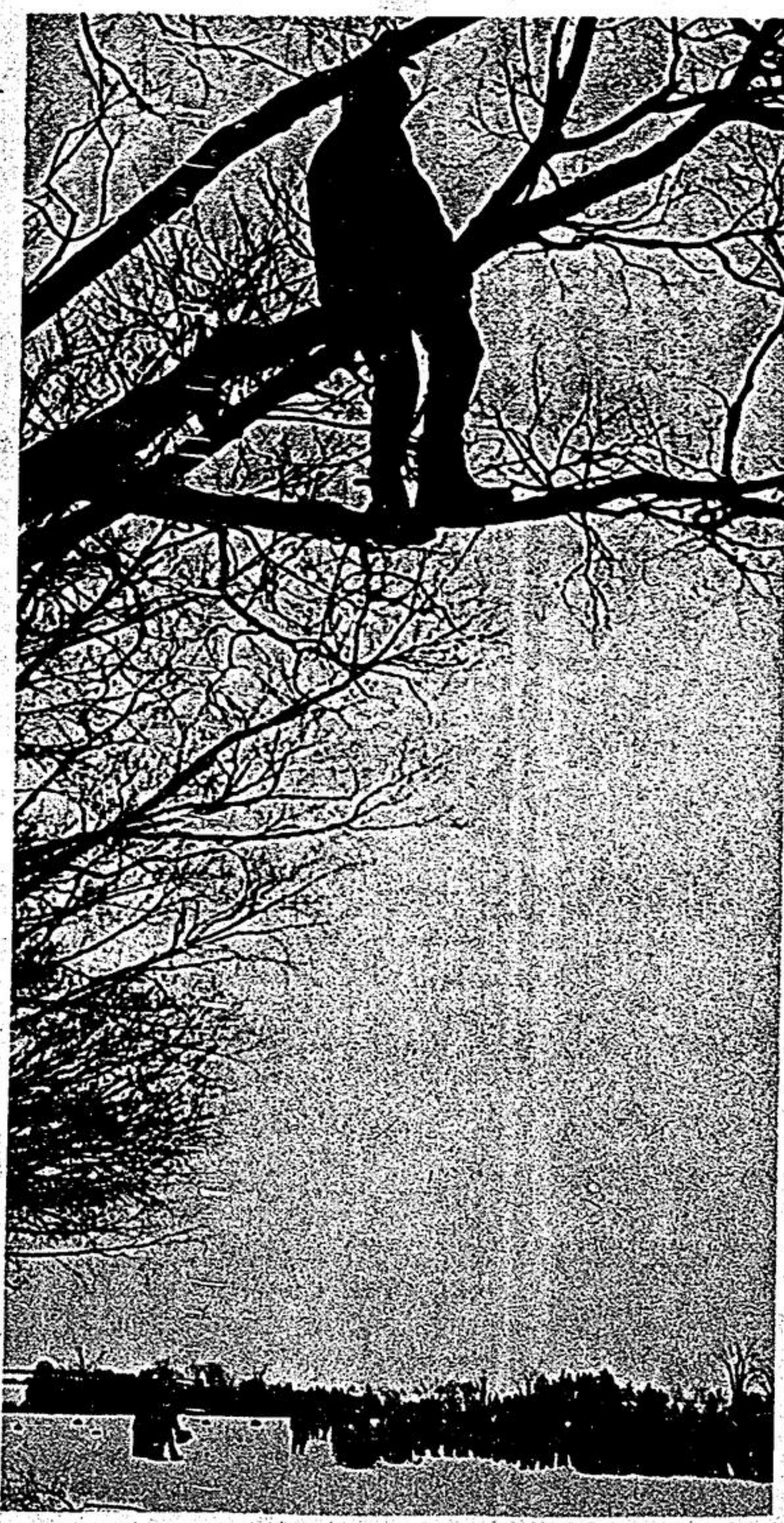
Donates \$200
