## Mr. and Mrs. George Middleton Fifty golden years

STOUFFVILLE - Fifty years - half a century. What is there to show for two people living together that long?

For Mr. and Mrs. George Middleton, Baker Avenue, the answer is easy. For hundreds of cards and many beautiful bouquets of flowers decorated the head table in the Stouffville Masonic Hall, Saturday, one indication of their wide circle of friends.

Mr. and Mrs. Middleton were married Feb. 16, 1921, but the Golden Anniversary celebration was held Feb. 20, as a convenience to guests, many travelling from a distance.

In addition to their long list of friends (over 100 callers, Saturday), Mr. and Mrs. Middleton are proud parents of two daughters, Velma (Mrs. Donald Scorgie), Scarborough; Violet (Mrs. Bernie Mitchell) in Indiana; one son, Donald, Burkholder St., Stouffville; six grandchildren and one great grandchild.

Mr. Middleton was born east of the Brock Road in Pickering Twp., one of three in the family of George and Georgina Middleton. A brother Jack lives at Ashburn and a sister Ada (Mrs. Lorne Ham) resides in Oshawa. He attended Cedar Creek Public School.

Mrs. Middleton, the former Hilda Ham, is also a native of Pickering Twp., born west of the Brock Road and one of five in the family of Frank and Hattie Ham. A brother Lorne lives in Oshawa.

There are three sisters, Myrtle (Mrs. Walter Baker), Stouffville; Nora of Clarendon and Marie (Mrs. Donald McCullough) of Newmarket. Mrs. Middleton attended Mt. Pleasant Public School on conc. 7.

Rev. A.M. McLellan of Clarendon United Church officiated at their wedding ceremony, held at the bride's parents home. Later, Mrs. Middleton's brother Lorne transported the newlyweds by horse and buggy to Clarendon station where they boarded the train on a honeymoon trip to Toronto, Orangeville and Grand Valley.

It was in 1941 that they sold their farm on the 4th concession of Uxbridge and moved to Clarendon. Two years later, they took up residence on Baker Avenue and have lived there ever since. The only change in that time was to move into a new bungalow next door, completed in 1963.

Mr. and Mrs. Middleton are avid euvre players and their presence at parties is always enjoyed by everyone. They are members of the Stouffville United Church and the Friendship Club. Mrs. Middleton's membership in the Women's Institute goes back 30 years.
