Mrs. Davis, a teacher at Queen Elizabeth School in Oshawa, half walked-half crawled from Balsam to her home on conc. 8, Pickering at the height of a blizzard, Feb. 13. Her face, neck and legs were frozen.

Mrs. Davis said that had she not found protection in a stalled car on the Balsam Road, she undoubtedly would have perished. "I was in there about five hours, but I thought it was only half an hour. I must have fallen asleep". She said visibility was reduced to such an extent, she would have gone by her own place had it not been for the mailbox.

On Friday, she received a host of get-well cards from her pupils. "It sure picked me up," she said.
