Late Emma Davis Dies in West

NAICAM, SASK. — Mrs. Emma Davis of Naicam, Saskatchewan, passed away in St. Paul's Hospital, Saskatoon, Jan. 12. She was born Emma Aletta Sherven Oct. 13, 1892, in Spillville, Iowa, the seventh daughter of Ole and Henrietta Sherven. Her mother passed away while she was a young child.

In 1910 she moved to Canada with her father and grandfather, finally settling in what is now known as the Lewis Lake District. She married Ace Davis of Stouffville, in 1923. Together they expanded the homesteaded land where son Eric now lives. All six of their children were born there. In 1943 Mr. and Mrs. Davis moved to LeRoy, where they owned and operated the hotel until retirement in 1950.

After a brief stay in Stouffville, they returned to Saskatchewan and settled in the town of Naicam. She is survived by three sons, Clayton of Saskatoon, Jack of Quill Lake, and Eric of Naicam; two daughters, Mrs. Fred Jones (Margaret) of Yellowknife, N.W.T., and Lois of Penitence, B.C.; one brother, Eric Sherven of Beach Grove, B.C.; two sisters, Mrs. A. Espeeth of Kinistino and Mrs. T. Smith of Melfort; twenty-one grandchildren and two great grandchildren. She was predeceased by her husband in 1966 and son Bob in 1964.

Funeral services were held Jan. 15, at 2 p.m. from Bethany United Church at Naicam. Interment was in the Naicam cemetery. Rev. D. Day officiated, and Mr. Henry Brenna of Naicam was organist. Pallbearers were six of her grandsons;

David and John Jones, and Doug, Dave, Wayne and John Davis. Honorary pallbearers were Marvin Weseen, Wes Hall, Francis Quaid, Lloyd Long, all of Naicam, Dr. Car Sherven of LaFleche, and Marvin Headrick of LeRoy. Out of town visitors included Mr. and Mrs. Earl Hoover and Mr. Carl Hoover of Stouffville.

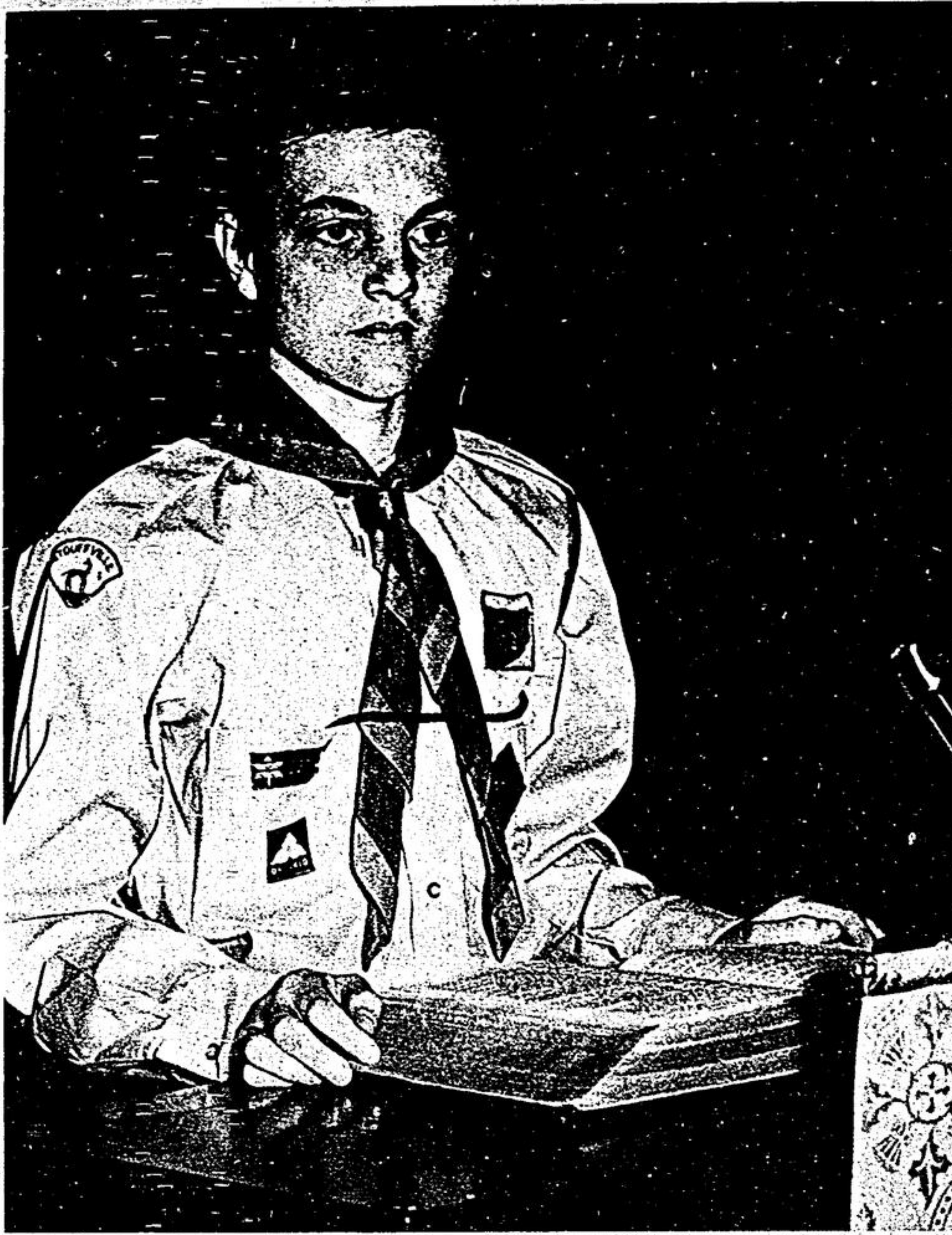
Enrollment climbs

How to Keep Your Provincial Health-Care Insurance Up-To-Date
WHEN YOU MARRY
Advise your group within 30 days or, if you are not in a group, write "OHSC & OHSP", 2195 Yonge Street, Toronto 7, give both names, your Ontario Hospital Insurance and O.H.S.I.P. numbers, and date of marriage.
WHEN YOU CHANGE JOBS
Follow carefully the instructions on the back of the OHSC and OHSP Certificates of Payment which your group is required to give you.
WHEN YOU HAVE (OR ADOPT) A CHILD
Only OHSP needs to be advised. If you are in a group, tell the group; if you are not, write OHSP... within 30 days.
IF YOUR CHILD TURNS 21 OR BECOMES SELF-SUPPORTING
He or she must now be enrolled separately either through your child's group (if he or she is working where there is one) or on a direct basis. Pay Direct application forms are obtainable in banks and hospitals or from OHSC and OHSP. If your child marries refer to "When You Marry" above.
