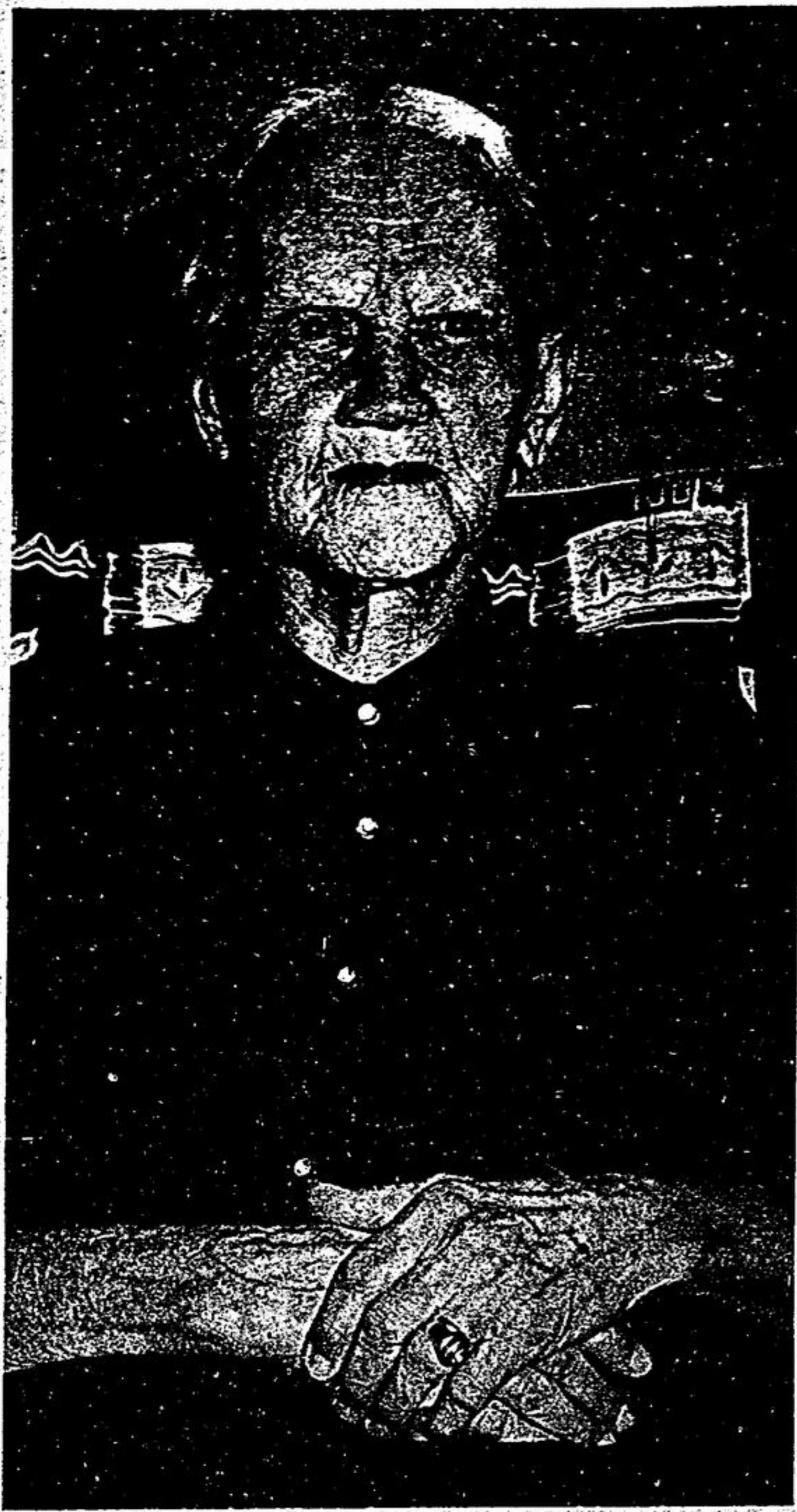


Late Ernest Harvey
