Thirty cents a bag

MARKHAM - A proposal that would revolutionize the system of garbage disposal in the Markham area has come before Council.

Under the new system, the total cost of garbage pickup would be absorbed through the sale of garbage bags. The green dog-proof container could be purchased by homeowners from local service stores at a cost of 30 cents each.

Under the present system, individual householders are billed every three months at a cost per week of \$.55 in the towns and \$.60 in the country.

Ralph Spademan, the originator of the scheme says the new system would save the majority of people money. "Ninety percent of the people

that we have talked to are in favor of the new scheme", the company spokesman told Council in committee.

Council voted to plan.


