But Lucy refuses, because she wants to be at home to greet her mother when she comes out of prison.

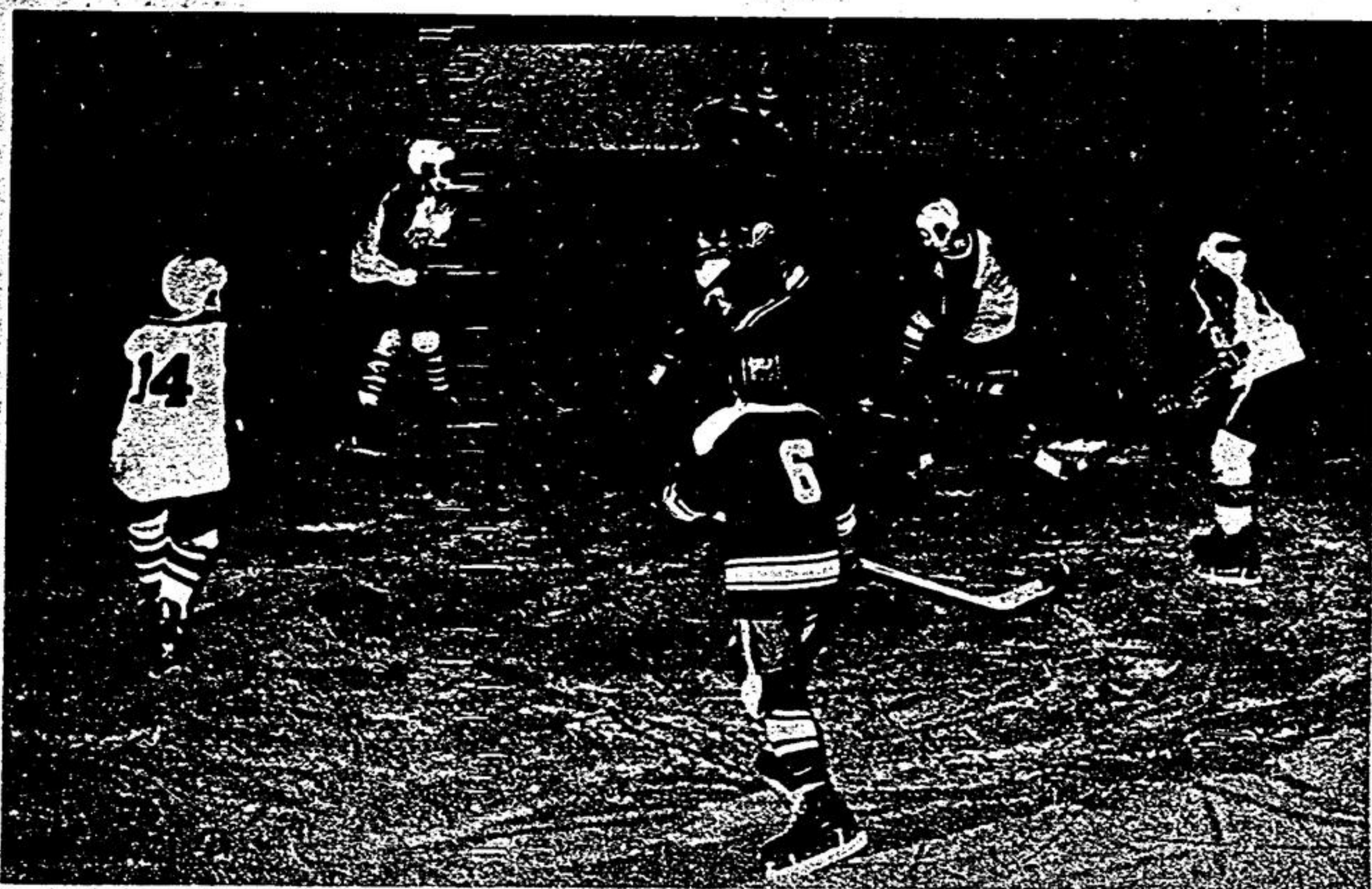
But the opening scenes drag, and the pace doesn't really pick up until the eccentric Hedda Rankin makes her entrance by falling over a cushion. Unfortunately, Michael and Lucy are the least colorful characters in the play. And the fact that many of Lucy's lines in the first few scenes were spoken too quickly to be understood, tended to make the audience impatient.

Even the entrance of Andrew and Fedra and the following humorous pantomime provides only temporary diversion.

The entire play stands or falls on Hedda's performance. And a great deal of recognition for the success of the evening goes to Phyllis Barnes for her spirited performance.

With a less capable leading lady, Hedda's character could easily disintegrate into bombast. But Mrs. Barnes plays her to perfection. Hedda is both loveable yet exasperating, inconsiderate yet well intentioned, arrogant yet humble, a stock character yet sympathetically human.

Hedda's foil, the unassuming, uncomplaining Felix Rankin is played by Bob Leach. Mr. Leach
