

Late Louis C. Murphy

School principal over thirty years

STOUFFVILLE - Born sixty-nine years ago, Louis C. Murphy passed away on Friday, March 19, at his home on William Street. Mr. Murphy, who retired in 1966, had been a secondary school principal for over thirty years.

He was born at Hilton, Ontario and graduated from Queen's University. Prior to coming to Stouffville in 1937, Mr. Murphy had been principal at Creemore. He continued as the head of the Stouffville school for fourteen years. After relinquishing his position here he taught at Oakville and Cockrane.

The deceased was a past president of the Lions Club, and a member of the Masonic Order, the Scottish Rite and Shriners. Mr. Murphy had a keen interest in music and led the United Church choir for a number of years. He also presented a number of school choirs at the annual Kiwanis Music Festival.

Among the many floral tributes was one from the former members of the Red Sox baseball team. The late Mr. Murphy was an ardent sports enthusiast and gave freely of his time for many years as an

O.B.A. umpire here. Surviving are his wife former Olive Plato, two daughters, Jeanne (Mrs. Walter Stanek) of Sault Ste. Marie, Marion (Mrs. Lorne Boadway), Stouffville, Dr. William Murphy, also of Stouffville and Edward, Toronto.

Following a special Masonic service, the public funeral was conducted at the O'Neill Chapel, Monday, by Rev. James Carder. The pallbearers were five nephews and one grandson, Max Westlake, Bob Plato, Pearce Plato, John Plato, Carroll Mallory and Rick Stanek.

Bused for safety

YORK REGION - A total of 824 students are transported to schools in York County for 'safety reasons' only, a report before the Board of Education revealed, March 22.

This involves four routes and costs an additional \$79 per day.

The majority of 'safety routes' are in Area 4 where 456 children are accommodated - 136 to Franklin School, Markham; 109 to Jefferson School, Richmond Hill and lesser numbers elsewhere.
