STOUFFVILLE - The opening of the Stouffville Community Swimming Pool is still a few weeks away, but already much work has gone into the appointment of persons to fill staff positions and formulate a program for the coming season.

The manager, as announced previously, is Peter Sanderson. The head instructor is Donna Skinner.

Senior instructors include - Kathy Roper, Jane Sanderson, Ron Ramer and Kevin Acton.

Junior instructors are - Jennie Bangay, Pat Ermen and Wayne Feasby.

Minor changes have been made in the hours for swimming. Instruction will be accommodated in two 4-week programs, July 5 to 29 and August 3 to 27. Lessons will be taught from 8 a.m. until 2 p.m., Monday through Friday and will encompass all Red Cross swimming courses (Beginner through Senior), Royal Lifesaving Society Bronze Medallion courses, plus courses in the wading pool and a new supplementary course called the 'Lion' to fill an obvious gap between Beginner and Junior.

Adult lessons will be offered during the months of July and August from 9 to 10 p.m., Monday through Wednesday, July 5 to 28 and August 2 to 25.

Stouffville will once again enter a team in the York County Summer Swim League and practices will be

held Monday through Friday, from 5 to 6 p.m., July 5 to August 28.

Public swimming hours will be the same as in previous years, 2 to 5 p.m. and 7 to 9 p.m., Monday through Saturday and 10 to 12 a.m., Saturday and 1 to 5 p.m., Sunday.

Rates for the season follow: Summer Family Season, \$20; Adult Season, \$8; Child Season, \$5.

Daily Weekday Admission is - Waders, 10 cents; Students, 25 cents; Adults 50 cents. Daily Weekend Ad-

mission is - Waders, 10 cents; Students, 25 cents; Adults, 75 cents.

Instruction Rates (per 4-week program) - Adult \$6; Child, \$5; Wader, \$3.

A new family rate will be incorporated this year. For \$40, a family receives a season's family ticket plus one month's instruction (one 4-week program) for each member of the family.

Plans are already being arranged for a special program of events during 'Water Safety Week', June 5 through June 12.
