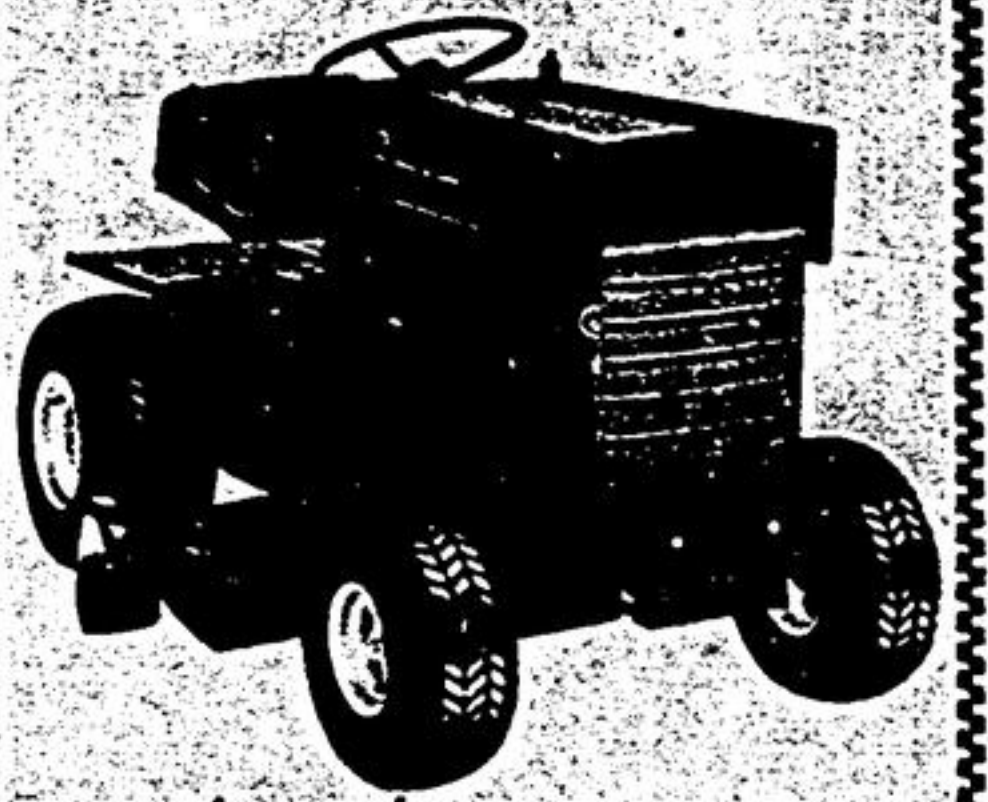
Mother's Sunday

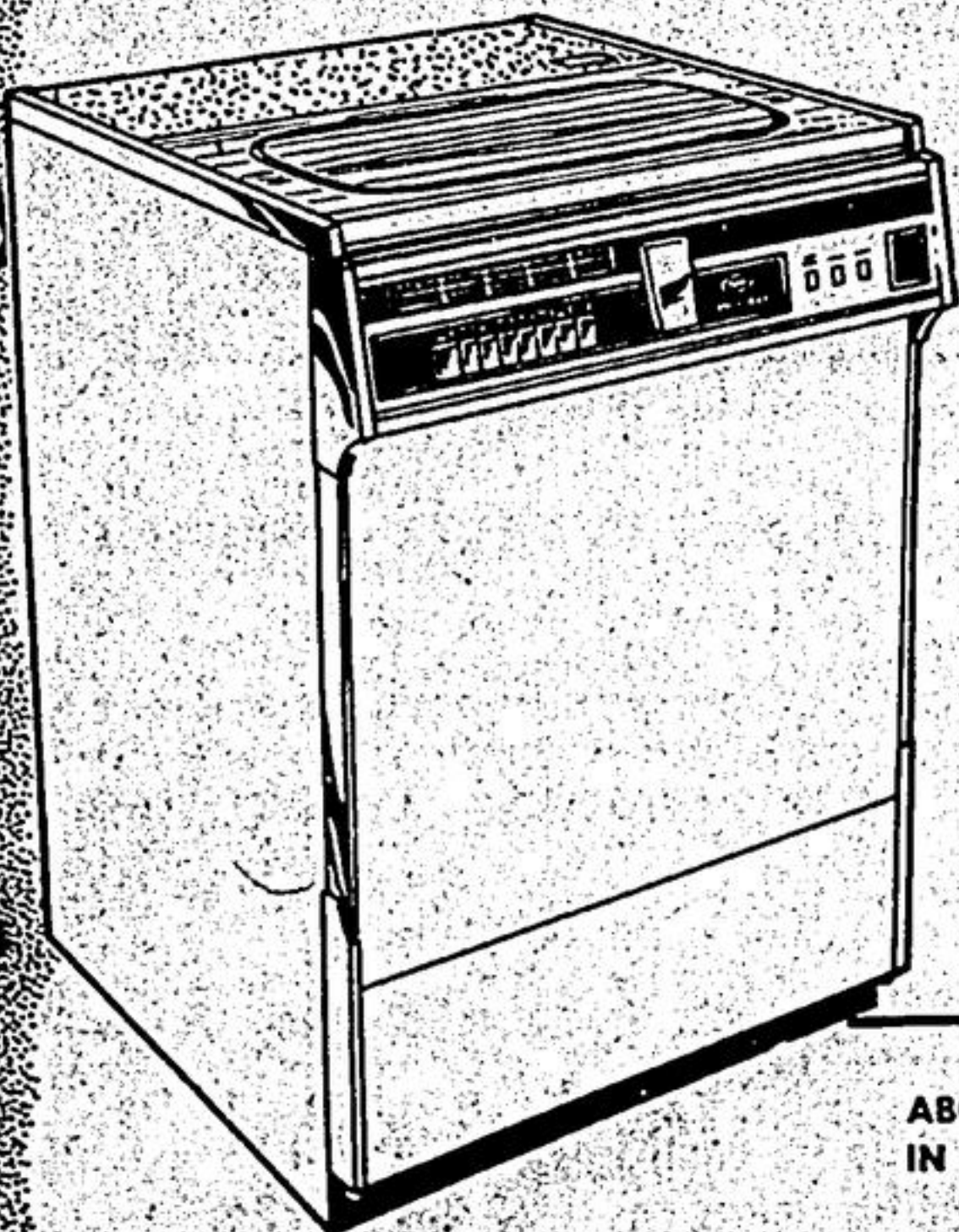
