### Died on day of his farm auction sale

For several weeks, Leslie Morgason had worked diligently towards the successful completion of his farm auction sale. It was scheduled for Saturday, May 8 and by Friday night, everything was in order.

On Saturday morning, he suffered a heart attack and passed away within minutes. Mr. Morgason was 84.

In spite of the sadness and suddenness of his death, the sale went on as planned. The deceased was possibly best known for his fence-building prowess. He left public school at an early age to practice the trade with his father and even late in life he could line up a row of posts without glasses.

His greatest enjoyment undoubtedly came from playing euchre. The fellowship gained through meeting old friends and winning new ones brought him great satisfaction. It was not uncommon for him to attend community euchres four and five nights a week. Few

persons could match his skill.

Surviving are three sons, Clifford of Argyle, Ontario, Lorne, Markham R.R.2, Harold at home and one daughter, Gertrude, also at the home residence. One sister, Mrs. Norman Adams lives in Uxbridge.

Mrs. Morgason, the former Violet Nesbitt, predeceased him in 1943.
