STOUFFVILLE - Despite a fickle weatherman and a cold damp Saturday morning, over 30 people turned out to participate in a tennis clinic held at Stouffville Park, May 8.

Sponsored by Jelinek Sports Limited of Oakville, the clinic was held to acquaint people with the basics of tennis and work up enthusiasm for the sport.
