Loved beauty of nature

UXBRIDGE TWP. - Levi Story, in his 94th year, died at Fairview Lodge on Tuesday, May 11 and was buried from the W. Kent Milroy Funeral Home, Claremont, May 14. Rev. Eldon Linsted conducted the service.

Born in Scott Township, Levi Story lived on the Chalk Lake Road in Uxbridge Township, for nearly 60 years. Noted for his love of nature, one of his favorite pastimes was to take long, quiet walks through his 200-acre farm, now preserved by the Metropolitan Toronto and Region Conservation Authority. He watched saplings grow into enormous trees during his many years on the property, admiring their girth and height. Each season was a new experience for him. Harvest time saw him either gathering his fruits and vegetables with pride in their perfection, or gazing from the top of a hill drinking in the beauty of the autumn foliage. Many hours were spent in his flower garden, riotous with color all summer long. In his earlier years he farmed some of the hilly land with horse and plow.

Predeceased by his wife, Annie Williams, in 1940, Mr. Story is the last member of his immediate family, his brothers Charles and Newton and sister Mrs. George Rogers (Hannah) having predeceased him several years ago.

Surviving are cousins George and Milton Story of Stouffville and nine nieces and nephews. Pallbearers were Stanley Todrow, James Jones, Edgar Fiss, William Hopkins, James Petty and Frank Gostick. Interment was in Claremont Cemetery.

Organize Red Cross homemaker service

STOUFFVILLE - Mrs. Rose Rank, supervisor for Red Cross homemaker service in the region for the past month, reports that a number of women are now undergoing an intensive series of 14 training sessions to prepare them for service in the Whitchurch - Stouffville Area. This type of work, says Mrs. Rank, is ideal for the mature woman who wants to work on a part time basis for a few days, a week or a month, assisting people in times of illness or family crisis, taking

over the responsibilities of homemaker. In cases, where the service is requested by the family, the family pays for the service, but in cases of financial hardship, fees are geared to income. Mrs. Rank emphasizes that the homemaker is not expected to be a nurse. If professional care is needed, the appropriate service is provided by the Victorian Order of Nurses or other competent, fully qualified people. To date about 39 women have been recruited through the Red Cross Office at 80 Bayview Avenue in Newmarket and are now engaged in the training program which covers problems that may be anticipated in working with a family. The prospective homemakers learn about community resources that may be helpful, the mental health association, York Regional Health Unit, family counselling service, etc., and how to contact them. There are sessions of nutrition, on planning, purchasing and preparation of food for families in various income groups, care of the home, understanding children, understanding the elderly, working with the sick patient, the new baby. Professionals from many fields talk about understanding mental illness, occupational

therapy, the ethics of homemaking, orientation to new family situations and public relations. The homemaker is supplied with an attractive uniform and guidebook which give detailed suggestions on baby routine, menu planning, recipes, and how to cope with unforeseen emergencies. The homemaker training says Mrs. Rank, is useful not only for the women who want to work in private homes, it is also excellent preparation for anyone who may be considering full time employment as a nurses' aid in a hospital. The program has been approved and will operate under supervision of Dr. Owen Slingerland, director of health and welfare for the Region of York. Mrs. Rank has a background of personnel counselling, psychology and supervision. She studied interview counselling at McMaster University in Hamilton and worked for five years with the
