Rev. V. G. Shillington Farewell service

VIVIAN - Pastor V.G. Shillington will deliver his farewell message to the congregation of McCormack Memorial Church, Vivian, Sunday evening, June 6 at 7:30 p.m.
On Friday, more than 75 adults and children gathered for a program of games, fellowship and refreshments. Expressions of best wishes were highlighted by the presentation of a lovely 5-piece silver tea service to the

minister, his wife, Grace and sons Ralph, 7 and Bradley, 2.
Since coming to Vivian in December, 1967, Mr. Shillington has witnessed a steady growth in attendance at both worship and Sunday School. A major emphasis on missionary outreach has been achieved through annual missionary conventions.

Mr. Shillington attended Central Baptist Seminary in Toronto until 1970, when he graduated, receiving the Bachelor of Theology degree. The family will be moving to 17 Austin Drive, Waterloo while Mr. Shillington takes post-graduate studies at the Waterloo Lutheran University.

In addition to increases in attendance, other programs within the church have been organized or expanded under the pastor's leadership including—Pioneer Girls, Christian Service Brigade Boys, Men's Fellowship Group, a New Life Hour held weekly in homes of the congregation and periodic teacher training and Bible study courses.

Most outstanding has been the growth of the annual missionary budget from \$1,250 to \$6,460, enabling partial support to be given eight foreign missionaries or missionary couples and three home missionary projects.

Assembly speaker claims —

Going steady 'a dumb institution'

STOUFFVILLE — Bernie Smith is not an ordained minister. He is not a platform orator. He is not a professional musician.
And yet, for two thirty minute assembly periods at Stouffville Dist. Secondary School, Thursday, he ministered, he sang, he played and addressed students from Grades 7 through 13 in language they accepted and understood.
They applauded when he termed going steady one of the dumbest institutions in life.

They laughed when he spoke of 'adding a little color' to the program. Mr. Smith is black.
There wasn't a whisper when, entirely by memory, he quoted an entire chapter from the Old Testament.
Who is Bernie Smith?
He's a native of

Warren, Ohio who, in 1958, came to Canada and joined the staff of Inter-Varsity Christian Fellowship as a travelling youth worker.
Now working freelance, he has addressed over 35 high school assemblies since the fall of '69 in addition to other demanding roles such as conference speaker, song leader and counsellor. He directs the 22-voice Tri Hi 'A Cappella Choir often featured in youth services and concerts. For five years, he taught public school in

Windsor and was later named the city's 'outstanding young man'.
He was introduced to the Stouffville students by Ken Wideman, President of the Inter-School Christian Fellowship.
What captured the attention of the young people most of all was the frankness with which Mr. Smith spoke. Although his remarks were geared to two distinct audiences, Grade 7 and 8 and Grades 9 through 13, he left no doubt concerning his stand on important

issues of our day.
He rapped the boy who, under the guise of love, would 'use' a girl for his own sexual gratification. He called him 'a fraud'.
In like manner, he criticized the girl who, through immodest dress and 'come-on looks', arouses sexual desires in a boy, desires that are not proper to fulfill.
To the elementary assembly he warned 'don't follow the crowd, just because someone tells you it's 'groovy'. It's not necessarily so' He observed that such

temptations could easily occur, particularly when public and high school age students are partially integrated into a single system. "Many high school students have 'sold out' on their home training," he said.
