**DID YOU KNOW** that on May 5, 1970, Design for Development, the Toronto-Centred Region was submitted in the Queen Elizabeth Building, CNE Grounds, Toronto by the Hon. John Roberts, then Prime Minister of Ontario, the Hon. Charles McNaughton and the Hon. Darcy McKeough? In this report was an intended growth pattern to stimulate the economy to the North East of Toronto.

**DID YOU KNOW** the Government believed that growth in this area was necessary if we intended to keep pace with the West of Toronto?

**DID YOU KNOW** they submitted an overall plan whereby the year 2000 a projected population growth in the south of Ontario County would be a possible increase of 800,000 including Oshawa?

**DID YOU KNOW** that the Township of Uxbridge is entitled to their share of the proposed economy planned by the Ontario Government and this committee would like to have the cake cut so that we have our share of this population to create Century City?

**DID YOU KNOW** if Century City is not approved that Uxbridge Township has lost the most exciting development to come to our area since its very existence?
