Turn sod for \$85,000 Anglican church

Archdeacon attends ceremony

MARKHAM — Sunday, June 6, marked a very special occasion in the life of the congregation of Grace Anglican Church, Markham.

The turning of the sod, four sods to be exact, celebrated the start of construction on a new \$85,000 church at a site adjacent to the parish hall, erected in 1959.

Participating in the ceremony was Archdeacon F.G. Ongley of Scarboro along with the rector, Rev. David Peasgood; Mr. John Armstrong of Locust Hill and two senior

members of the parish, Mrs. Hannah Williamson and Mr. Harry Rolph.

Representing the youth of the congregation were choir boys, Roger and Mark Carlsen.

It was unique that Mr. Armstrong should attend. It was his great grand-father, Captain William Armstrong who donated the original site for Grace Anglican Church, back in 1846, just 125 years ago.

Mrs. Williamson, well-known and highly respected in the community, has been

active in both the W.A. and the Sunday School. Mr. Rolph has served as church warden and a member of the Cemetery Board for 40 years.

"Today," said Rev. Peasgood, "the church at large and a Parish Family, begin the actual erection of a place of worship. It is an occasion of great joy and deep meaning for all of us. We pray that God may continue to lead and bless us as we proceed in this undertaking on behalf of the Christian mission in this community."
