

German festival


MARKHAM - The Rotary Club of Markham is sponsoring the Town's first German Beer Festival in the Markham Arena, this Saturday, June 12.

The Expropriations Act, 1968-69 NOTICE OF APPLICATION FOR APPROVAL TO DEPARTMENT OF EXPROPRIATE LAND AND COMMUNICATIONS

IN THE MATTER of an application by the Minister of Transportation and Communications, for approval to expropriate lands in the Town of Whitechurch-Stouffville, Regional Municipality of York, formerly in the Village of Stouffville, County of York, for the purpose of acquiring sufficient land for the widening and reconstruction of Highway Number 47.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that application has been made for approval to expropriate the land described in the schedule hereto.

Any owner of lands in respect of which notice is given who desires an inquiry into whether the taking of such land is fair, sound and reasonable necessary in the achievement of the objectives of the expropriating authority shall so notify the approving authority in writing.

- (a) in the case of a registered owner, served personally or by registered mail within thirty days after he is served with the notice, or when he is served by publication, within thirty days after the first publication of the notice;
- (b) in the case of an owner who is not a registered owner, within thirty days after the first publication of the notice.

NOTES:

1. The Expropriations Act, 1968-69 provides that:
 - (a) where an inquiry is registered, it shall be conducted by an inquiry officer appointed by the Minister of Justice and Attorney General;
 - (b) the inquiry officer,
 - (i) shall give every party to the inquiry an opportunity to present evidence and argument, and to examine and cross-examine witnesses, either personally or by his counsel or agent, and
 - (ii) may recommend to the approving authority that a party to the inquiry be paid a fixed amount for his costs of the inquiry not to exceed \$200 and the approving authority may in its discretion order the expropriating authority to pay such costs forthwith.

1. "owner" and "registered owner" are defined in the Act as follows:

"owner" includes a mortgagee, tenant, execution creditor, a person entitled to a limited estate or interest in land, a committee of the estate of a mentally incompetent person, or of a person incapable of managing his affairs, and a guardian, executor, administrator or trustee in whom land is vested.

"registered owner" means an owner of land whose interest in the land is defined and whose name is specified in an instrument in the proper registry, land titles or sheriff's office, and includes a person shown as a tenant of land on the last revised assessment roll.

2. The expropriating authority, each owner who notifies the approving authority that he desires a hearing in respect of the lands intended to be expropriated and any owner added at a party by the inquiry officer are parties to the inquiry.

Proposed zoning by-law bogs development

STOUFFVILLE Although form letters are being sent out to prospective subdividers advising that re-zoning in the Whitechurch - Stouffville area is not being considered until the consolidated bylaw is finished, the change in procedure failed to discourage applicants who approached planning committee with plans for development, June 2.

A proposal to develop 42 acres of land at conc. 4 was the first to be shelved.

Appearing before Planning Committee, Solicitor John Daniels said his principals proposed to allow home-owners to lease 2 acres of land for a total of 45 years. Mr. Daniels felt this arrangement would offer many advantages.

"The home-owners would only have to assume the costs of building the house and paying a minimal

service charge to look after the private road. I'm satisfied the plan would attract people. The development would back onto the Rolling Hills Golf Course on one side and a trout stream on the other", he told the committee.

But Mayor Ken Laushway wasn't encouraging. "You're in the same category as everyone else", he said. "Planning Committee is in the process of re-writing the bylaw and won't be finished until October. Even then, not every plan that is discussed will be approved."

An application to expand the S & K Drive-In, Don Mills Road, at the Gormley Sideroad, was also deferred pending completion of the bylaw.

Speaking on behalf of proprietor Spyros Kabiotis, solicitor Thomas McPherson told members his client needed the
