Mr. Clarence Doner has been discharged from York County Hospital, Newmarket.

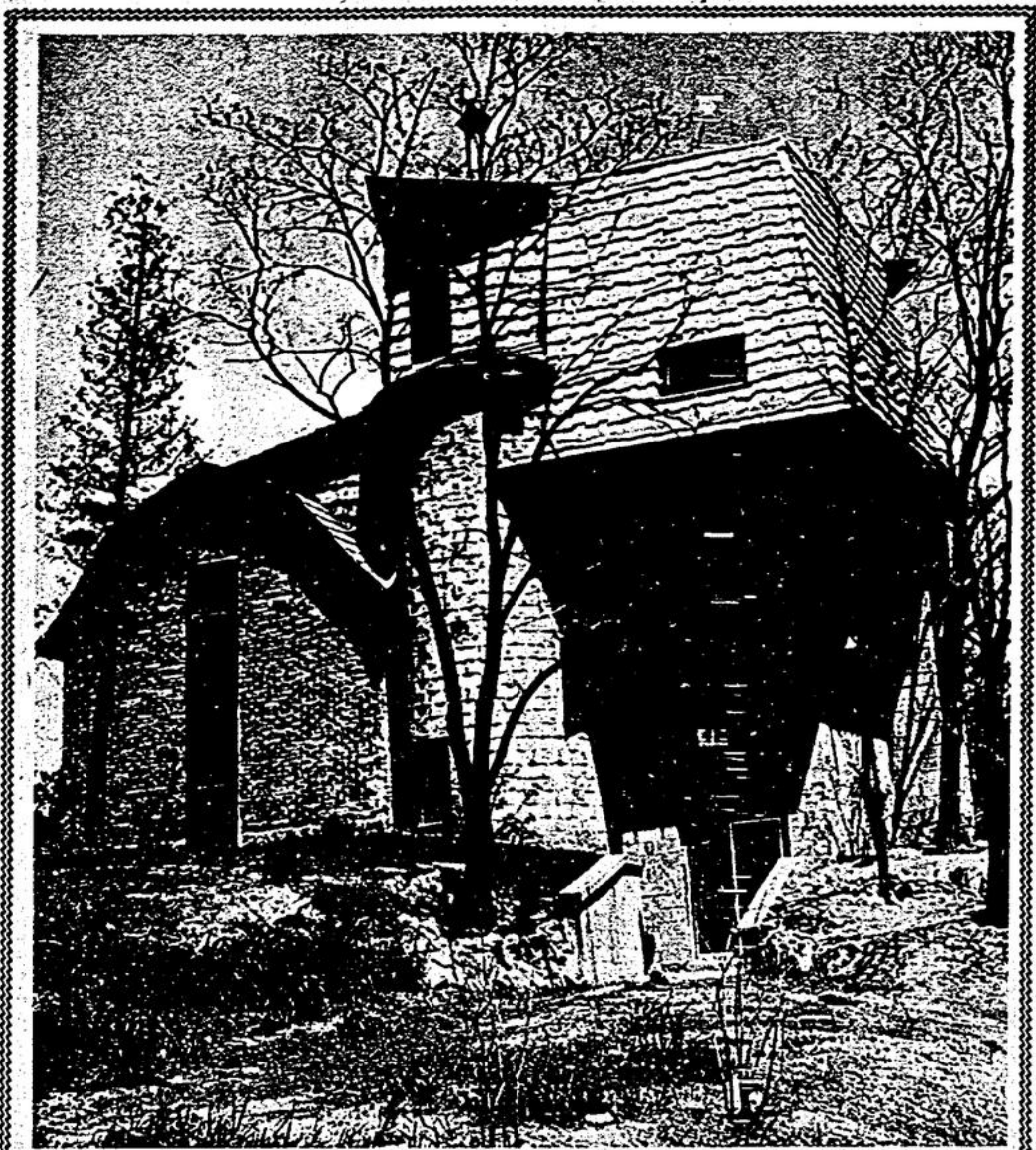
Miss Verna Brillinger is being transferred from Choma, Zambia for the months of June and July to the Mission Staff in Bulawayo, Rhodesia, Africa.
