# Art '71 - Bigger and better

**MARKHAM** - The Kiwanis-sponsored Art Show in Markham - Arts '71 - was bigger and better than ever. Markham Arena was filled with the displays.

Many of the exhibits were outstanding, both in technique and conception. The display merits serious attention from anyone interested in original art for his home.

There were the usual landscapes, seascapes, and still-life studies. Some of these were very impressive. I particularly liked a couple by Edith Stankus: 'November, Boshkung Lake' and 'October Algoma'.

There were also the usual oil-on-velvet paintings, which I've somehow never learned to appreciate. The exhibit contained some pen-and-ink work which I found especially attractive. Four character sketches at \$18 each, provided a fine example of Conte Pencil work.

The true highlight of the show, as far as I could judge, was the work in abstracts. Abstract paintings are not everybody's cup of tea; but some of the examples at Art '71 are truly excellent.

Wedor Saldabron's 'Stimulus 5' was 'powerful' although, at \$525, a bit beyond the price range of most of us. Reg Phang exhibited two abstracts in acrylic plastic which I liked. I don't claim to understand them, but I liked them - even at \$150.

Sculptures composed a small part of the exhibit and, frankly, I didn't find them too thrilling. Murray Fallaise's 'Expo' and 'Large Circles' didn't do much for me; still, his 'Steel and Bronze' I found interesting.

If you're looking for something really well done in the way of art, the Kiwanis Show provides a great place to search. Prices range from \$12 to well over \$500 - something for every budget.

After seeing this year's show, I'm genuinely looking forward to next Art '72. No doubt it will be even bigger and better.
