## Town office has 'new look'



STOUFFVILLE - The municipal office interior, Town of Whitchurch-Stouffville, has undergone such major alterations and additions within recent weeks, ratepayers may need a directory and a road map to reach the right department.

The Mayor's office is now located on the ground floor, in space previously occupied by the clerk. The deputy-clerk, Elwood Foskett, occupies an adjoining office. Also on the ground floor is the treasury and tax departments.

The general office and reception however, are located on the second floor. Clerk Ralph Corner, Bylaw Enforcement Officer, Marshall Miller; Stouffville Community Centre Board Secretary, Thomas Withers and Planning Board Secretary Mrs. Rona Boocock all have offices in this area.

Also working from this floor are Mrs. Yowney, Secretary of the Community Centre Board (Ballantrae) and Mrs. Warden, Secretary of the Whitchurch-Stouffville Recreation Committee and of the Community Centre Board for Vandorf.

Anyone seeking a licence - for a dog, a restaurant, or a marriage - will also be directed to the second floor and Mrs. Muir, the receptionist.

The council chambers and two committee rooms are located across from the general offices. A directory board has been ordered, and will be placed at the main entrance.

The Works Department has been split between Ernest Davis, at Vandorf and Ron Gibson, at the Stouffville. Mr. Davis is primarily concerned with the rural area, while Mr. Gibson is in charge of the urban region. Mr. Gibson also handles complaints or representations concerning the water system, although any question over billings should be referred to Gerald Pegg at the Public Utilities Commission.
