

# Hybrid roadster five cars in one

**STOUFFVILLE** - When John and Lynda Willis, Market Street, Stouffville, take a spin around town, people stop and stare.

Their car is no Rolls-Royce or Cadillac. Instead it's a combination of several cars. John pieced it together himself, with assistance from Doug Stouffer. It took three winters to complete.

While registered as a 1922 Ford, the only resemblance to the original model is in the frame. The motor and transmission are from an Oldsmobile, the front end belongs to a Volkswagen; the rear axle from a Pontiac and the instrument panel from a Sunbeam. The body is fibreglass.

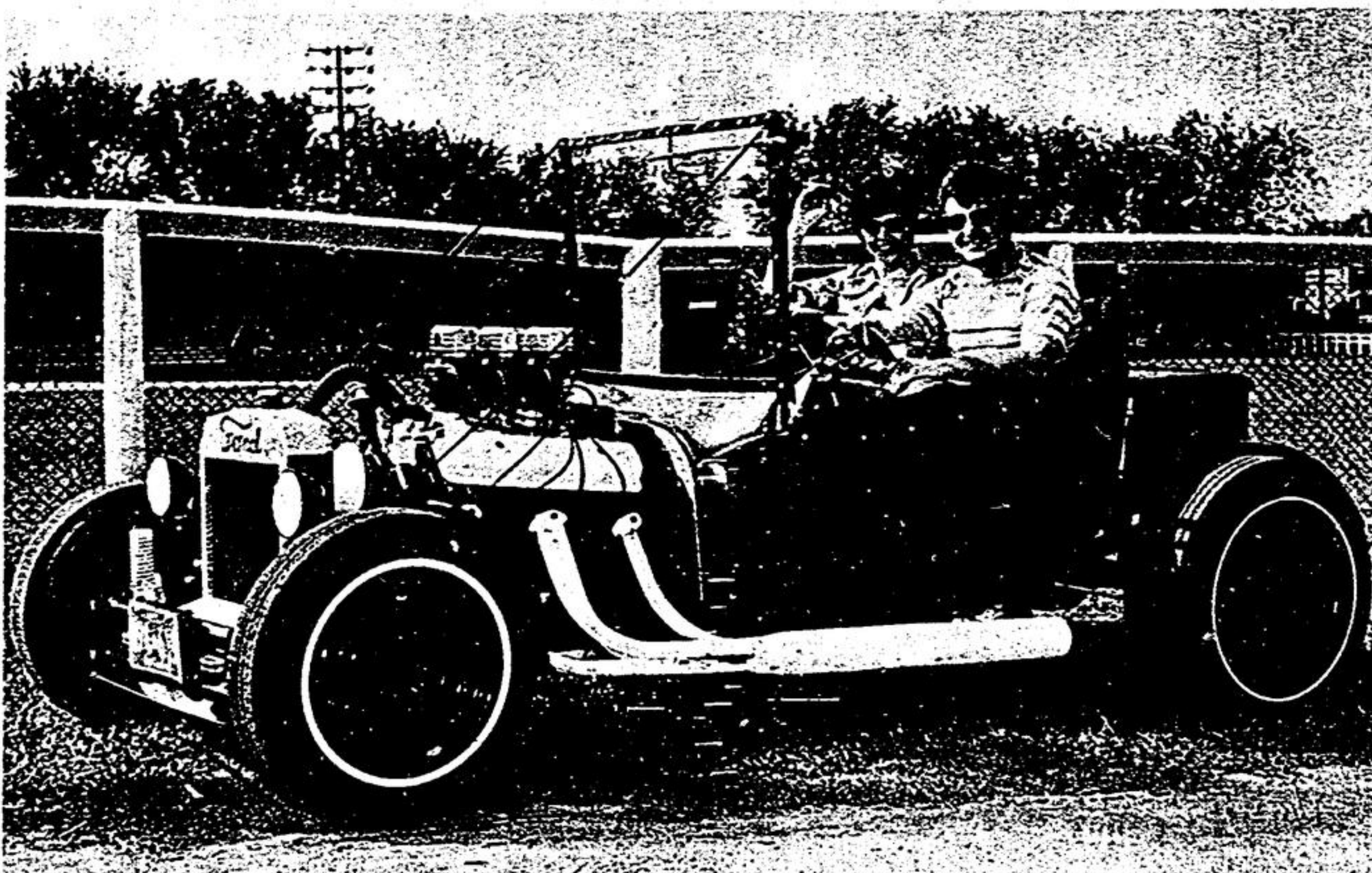
The runabout adheres to all specifications as demanded by the Dept. of Highways, even to electric windshield wipers. It was given a

The only disappointing feature, as far as John is concerned is the muffler system. It makes a bit too much noise, but to correct it now would mean a major overhaul. "I didn't intend it to be that way, but I don't think it should bother anyone", the owner explained.

For John and Lynda, it's strictly a "fun thing". And it's not for sale - at least not now. "I think I'll hang onto it for awhile," he said, "It's pretty well the way I want it."

John comes by his ability honestly. He's served as an apprentice mechanic at Giles Chev-Olds, Stouffville, for the past three years. This week, he received his licence.
