Area paralyzed claims planner

STOUFFVILLE The Toronto Centred Region concept, as initially presented by former Premier John. Robarts in May, 1970, seems to represent a form of paralysis rather than enlightened planning.

This is the claim of Conroy G. Dowson, ! Director of Planning, R.V. Anderson Associates Limited,

Toronto. Originally, Mr. Dowson points out, the Plan was intended to controlled growth within a 90-mile arc of Toronto or about 8,600 square miles from Hamilton Collingwood Cobourg.

A three-zoned region was established to encourage and, in some instances discourage development of industry, housing, highways, utility services and population. However, according to Mr. Dowson, there was no suggestion as to how such controls might be enforced or
