LEMONVILLE - Mr. R.G. Fairbanks, Willowmead Farm, R.R. 4, Stouffville, has been a member of the Foster Parents Plan of Canada for 18 years.

During this time, he has supported four persons, including two Italian children, a little Vietnamese girl and now, a small Bolivian boy.

His name is Victor Calle.

Through contributions of \$17 a month, Mr. Fairbanks gives the child and the family assistance in the purchase of food, clothing, medical and dental care.

Victor's parents both work as common laborers, earning \$38 a month. They reside in a crude two-room hut. There is electricity, but no bathroom facilities and water must be carried in, using pails, buckets and pans. The public faucet is a long way from home.

Victor is 12 years old. He has two sisters and a brother.

Foster Parents Plan is currently working in ten countries in South America and Asia. Over 53,000 children are currently receiving assistance from individuals, groups and families in the United States, Canada and Australia.
