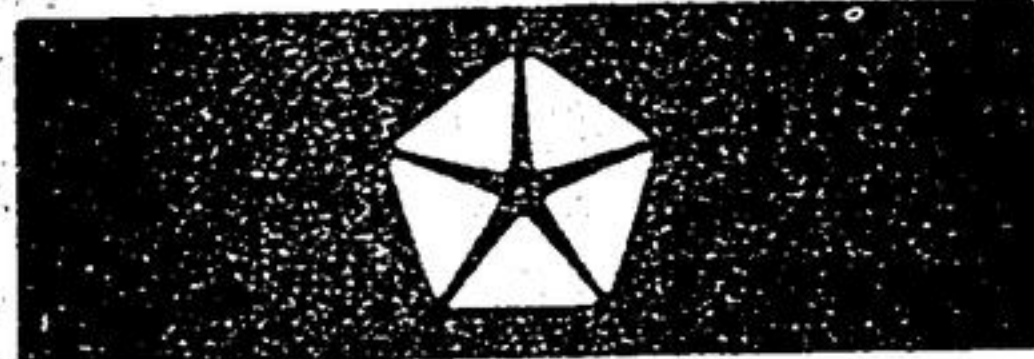
Vivian School held their field day, June 28. On Tuesday, June 27, the children visited Mrs. Boynton's farm near Mt. Albert.

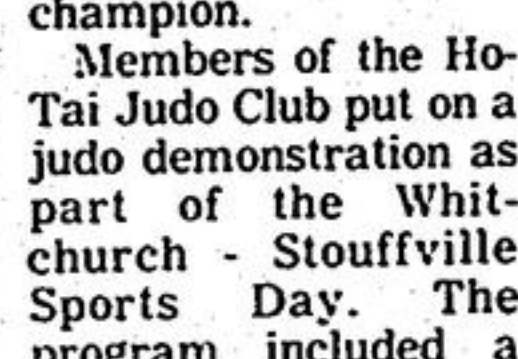
