

Pond poisoned by GOODWOOD - What has been described as

'a freak combination of circumstances' brought death to seven cattle on the property of Stanley Feasby, R. R. 1, Goodwood, one year ago.

A full report on the case, filed with the Stouffville Veterinary Clinic by the Ontario Water Resources Commission, has been released to The Tribune by Dr. Dennis O'Connor. Investigation

that vealed animals drank water from a farm pond containing a species of blue-green algae. Several factors, according to O.W.R.C., turned the algae poisonous.

A prime contributor

was the weather - hot and sunny, raising the water temperature to between 75 and 80 degrees. Secondly, a supply of nutrients, especially nitrogen and phosphorous caused the algae to 'bloom'.

Other considerations were - the lack of rooted plants in the pond, its size and location. All these conditions combined to create a toxic substance, ruled 'a phenomenon and quite unpredictable' by the Commission.

Dr. O'Connor explained that algae, so stimulated, would act like a nerve poison and prove fatal. He said a similar reaction would occur following human consumption. warned against allowing children to
