Awarded Certificate of Merit

STOUFFVILLE - Seventeen year old Kevin Acton, son of Mr. and Mrs. Jerry Acton, Burkholder St., Stouffville, has received a Certificate

of Merit from Minister of Education, Hon. Robert Welch. The award is in recognition of Kevin's prominence in speed skating at the 1971 Canada Games held last February in Saskatoon.

An accompanying letter reads: "The Government of Ontario is proud of your accomplishment in winning, for the third consecutive time, the national championship, and is more than proud of the excellent manner in which you represented this province."

"I am pleased to enclose with this letter a certificate of participation in the games, which also identifies Ontario as the National Champion, along with a gold medal, presented to you by the Province of Ontario in recognition of your participation in, and accomplishments at, the 1971 Canada Winter Games."
