Mrs. Gerrude Briggs, Oshawa, spent last week with her sister, Mrs. Burnett Jamieson.

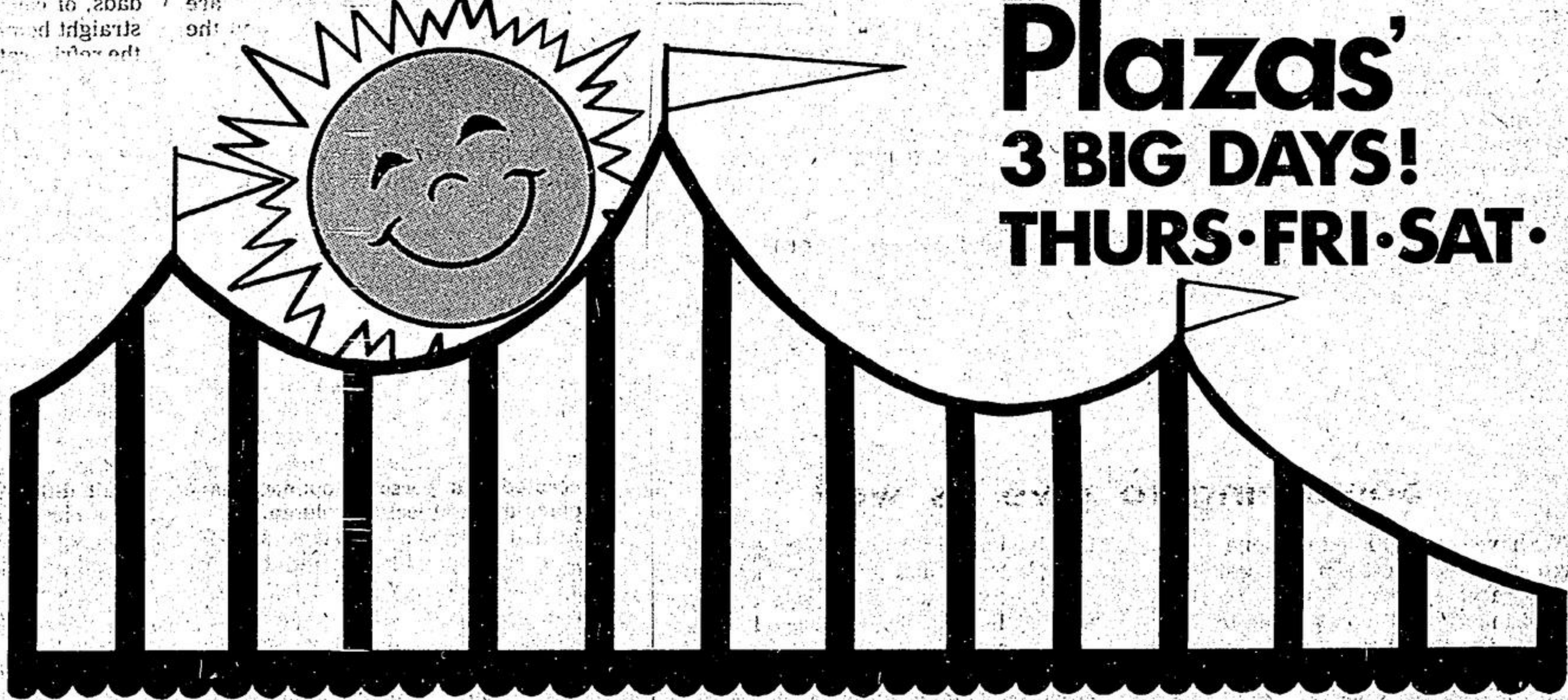
