# Town swim team places second

Score 210 points

STOUFFVILLE - The Stouffville Competitive Swim Team splashed their way to second place, behind Markham in Saturday's meet. Markham finished with 270 points, Stouffville 210 and Unionville 170.

Erika DeBruyn showed tremendous ability and swimming strength, placing first in all senior girls' events, earning 24 points. They included the 100 yard and 50 yard freestyle, the 50 yard butterfly and breast-stroke.

Dianne Ermen, in the 11 and 12 year old class, was also an important entry, winning the 25 yard freestyle, breast, and butterfly and placing third in the 25 yard backcrawl.

Geoff Aiken was fastest in the senior boys 50 yard breast-stroke and took first in the 15 and 16 year old breast-stroke match. In the ten and under category Brad Steel took the 25-yard breast-stroke and backcrawl but was edged out in the freestyle by perhaps the most improved swimmer, according to coach Pete Sanderson, Tim Brazier.

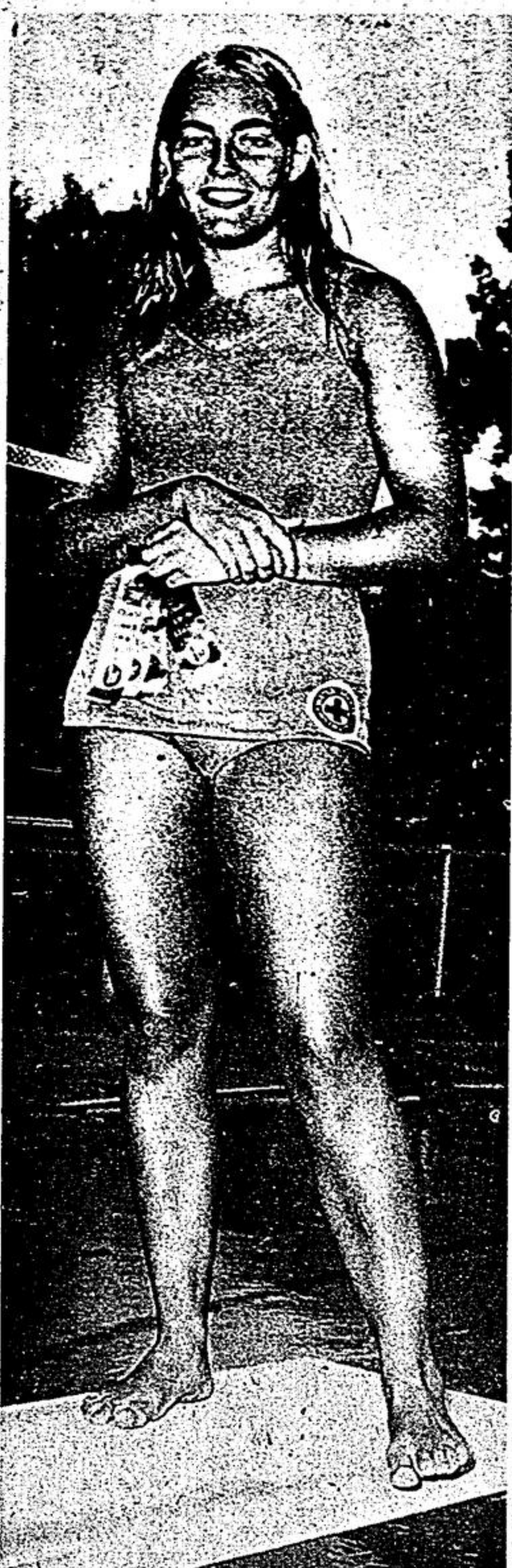
In the grouping of 11 and 12 year old boys, Chris McDermott showed his form, taking top honors in the 25-yard breast and backcrawl.

Gail Newmarch maintained Stouffville's female strength in the 13 and 14 class, winning the 50-yard freestyle and placing second in the backcrawl, just three-tenths of a second behind the winner.

Other Stouffville wins included the 200-yard boys medley relay and the girls freestyle relay. It also looked as if the ladies had their medley relay wrapped up as well, but they were disqualified for missing a tag.

Ray Pickell singled in the first run of the game to start Sunderland, Luckily, for the visitors, there was no one on base when Dave Slack sent a grand-slam homer over the fence in the third. Later, Roger Todd singled in the tie-breaking run. That lead lasted until Sunderland's four-run fifth inning.
