At Vandorf Approve Royal Bank branch VANDORF - The Royal Bank of Canada has entered into an agreement with the Town of Whitchurch-Stouffville, to lease the former municipal office building at Vandorf and establish a new branch there. The official opening is expected early this fall, possibly October. It was former Whitchurch deputy-reeve, Lawrence Hennessey who finalized the arrangement, working through the head office of Crown Trust. The Royal already has several excellent accounts in the area, Mr. Hennessey said. Only minor renovations will be required, Mr. Hennessey explained. The interior of the two-storey structure has 2,000 square feet of useable space plus adequate parking facilities. It will mark the first bank branch to be established in the former Whitchurch area. hope that it wouldn't be required, was approved unanimously at a meeting of Whitchurch-Stouffville council, Aug. 10.
