

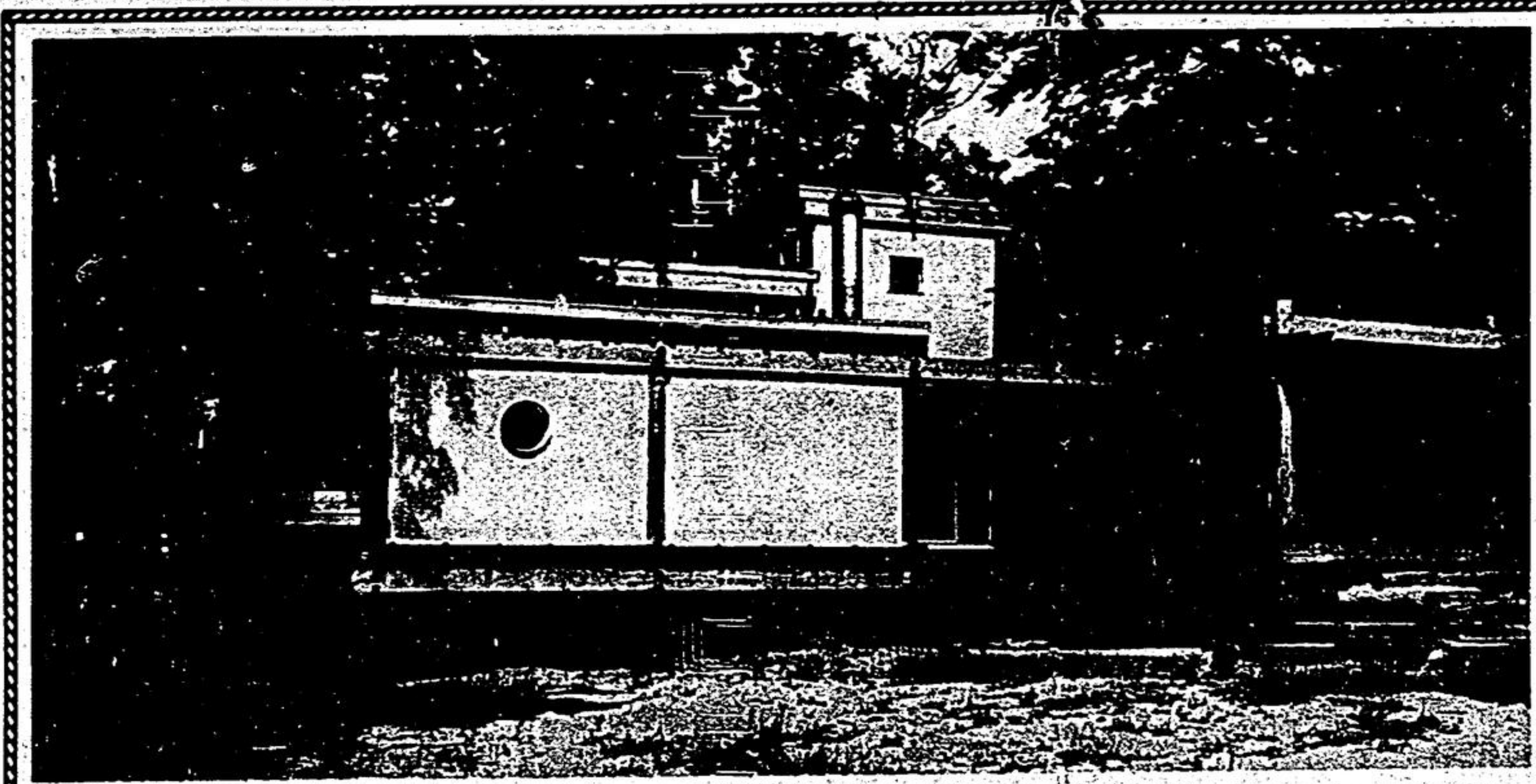
Tis the season

STOUFFVILLE - A 16 year old Stouffville district lad has learned the hard way, a few facts concerning the safe operation of an automobile. Maris Robert Paulens, R.R. 4 was convicted of dangerous driving when he appeared before Judge C.W. Morrison in Newmarket Court, Aug. 10. Judge Morrison observed: "I don't believe this young man is mature enough to own or drive a car." In addition to \$100 fine, the Judge issued an order prohibiting Paulens from driving anywhere in Canada for one year. Evidence showed the accused was the subject of a police chase along several streets in Stouffville, before being stopped on Ninth Line North. Judge Morrison observed that Paulens had, up to that time, been convicted of no other driving offense and no accident had resulted in the one occurrence.
