Messrs. Harry Stemp and William Keyzers owners of Uxbridge Printing Company Ltd., also publish the Lake Simcoe Advocate in Sutton, Ontario, and own Stouffville Printing Company. The Lake Simcoe Advocate and the Markham Economist and Sun are the only weekly newspapers independently owned and operated in the Region of York.

Harry Stemp has been named President of the company, Edith Weber and William Keyzers are co-publishers and Mrs. Weber has also been named Editor. Mr. Mel. Williams will remain on staff as Editor Emeritus.
