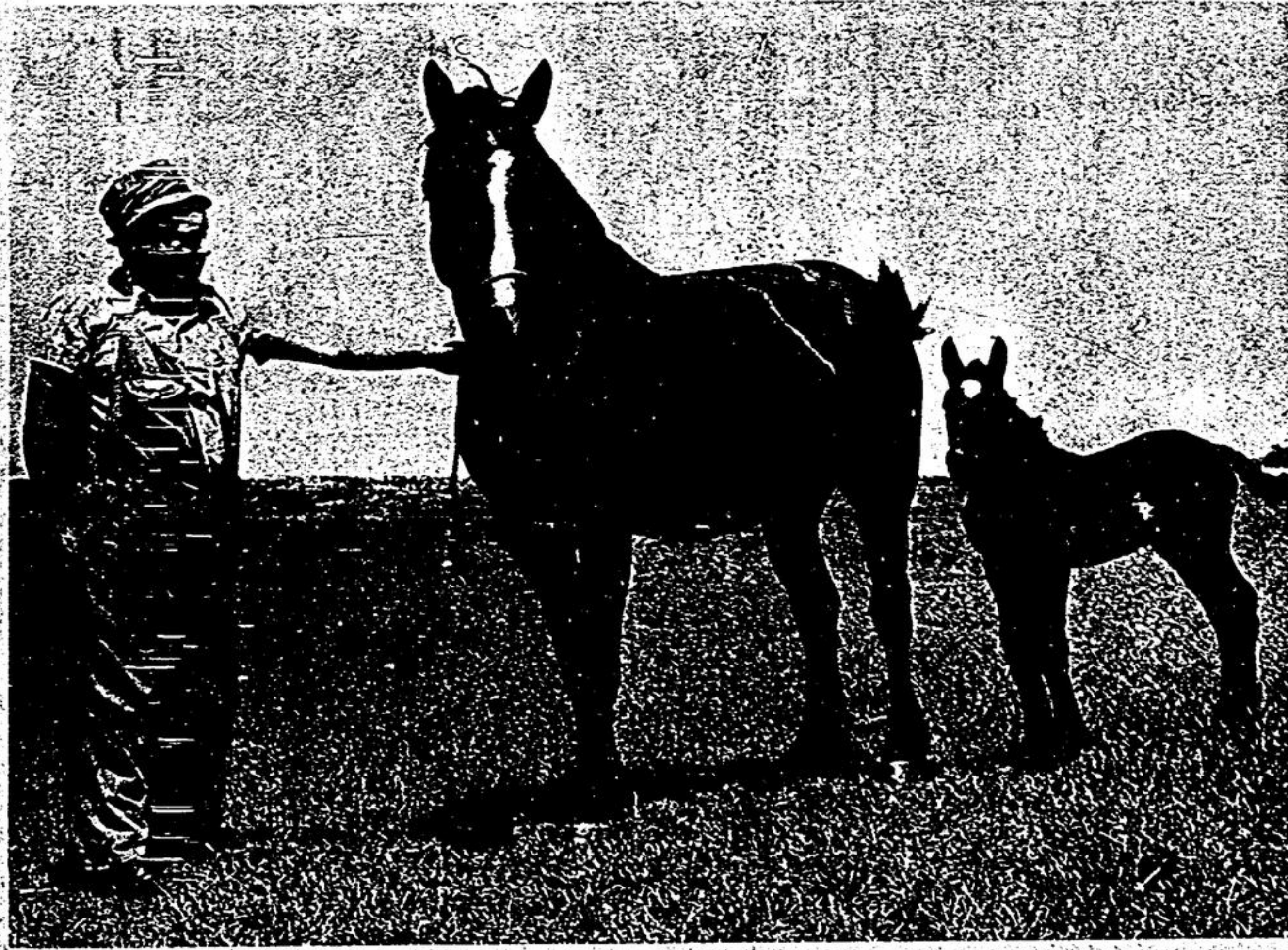

### Pig stabbed by rustlers

**MYRTLE** Two Toronto men have been remanded in custody to Sept. 21, following conviction in Whitby Court of stealing and killing a pig on a Myrtle area farm. Evidence revealed that Sydney Gurr, 24, of Sackville Street and James Young, 22, of Shuter Street, entered a barn on the property of James Cook, Myrtle Station, pulled a sow away from her month-old piglets and stabbed the animal several times with a bayonet-type knife. When the pig was dead, evidence continued, the accused discovered they could not lift it over a fence. They then fled, leaving the animal in the field. Crown Attorney Bruce Affleck said that while the men could have been under the influence of alcohol and the crime seemed like a kind of prank, a suspended sentence would be in order providing restitution was made to the animal's owner. Judge Harry Jermy took a more serious view. "I can't think of a more cruel and thoughtless deed," he said "in addition to the farmer's loss, you caused a great deal of suffering to a helpless beast." He called for a pre-sentence report.

## Unionville Ayrshire herd is top producer

**YORK REGION** Dairy cows here in York are milking better than ever. The average for our top herds goes a little higher each year, and the latest R.O.P. figures give us three herds right around the 16,000 pound level. Fieldhouse Farms at Woodbridge achieved the highest production, with Robert King also of Woodbridge, right up there too. These are just two of a whole group of Holstein breeders with com-

posite B.C.A.'s of over 145. Some others are Alvin Pegg, Newmarket, Green Valley Farms, Kleinburg, Peter Posnikoff, Port Hope, and Fergus MacLaggart, Schomberg. In Ayrshires, M.L. Jarvis, at Unionville, and Morley Cook at Armitage had the two best producing herds; and in Guernseys, Kingfield Farms and Tannery Hill Farms were best. The best milking Jerseys were in the herds of Don and Norm Bagg at Woodbridge and Laszio Toth of Newmarket. There is always a fear that the cost of keeping production up at these high levels takes a lot of the profit. Actually it's the

other way around. The great boost from lots of profit picture gets a milk.
