A haven or hangout - residents wonder

STOUFFVILLE What's the true story on reported occurrences in the area of Stouffville's flood control dam, between Church and Edward Streets?

Is it really the greenbelt 'haven' it was meant to be, or a 'hangout' for kids with nothing to do?

Nearby residents would like to know.

So would the police.

All summer there have been rumors and rumblings of teen gatherings in the area, but frequent visits by officers have revealed nothing more than a few lads enjoying a 'skinny-dip' in the man-made lake to cool off.

The latest episode, around 2 a.m., Aug. 18,

had police on the scene again. But as soon as the lights of the cruiser were spotted, the crowd dispersed.

There was evidence however that someone had been injured. A considerable amount of blood was visible on the ground.

One Church Street resident said the screams of a girl were so loud, it woke him up. Others were similarly startled.

It is believed that a companion accidentally fell off the dam abutment into the water and was feared drowned.

One informant told The Tribune that several of the young people were 'high' on drugs at the time.

Measure kart noise

Dear Sir:

Please let me clarify what seems to be a misunderstanding by your paper concerning the activities of Pollution Probe and the Canadian Environmental Law Foundation in Uxbridge Township. These voluntary organizations jointly provide a Noise Complaint Service which attempts to give information and advice to anyone interested in or troubled by noise.

On Sunday, 13 June, 1971, I took sound level measurements at the Goodwood Cartways go-cart track on the Second Concession Road in Uxbridge Township. This was done at the request of the Bell family, owners of the track, who wished to know if their machines conformed to the local bylaw. My advice to them was that while most of their go-carts came within the bylaw limit of 90 dB(A) at 75 ft., a minority of them did not. I suggested that they improve their noisiest machines and then seek another, possibly more official sound level measurement.
