Reginald M. Brophy

Motorola chairman

CLAREMONT - The Claremont community lost a prominent Canadian and leading industrialist, in the recent death of Reginald McLaren Brophy, Brock Road, Pickering Township.

Services were conducted by Rev. E. R. Kirker of St. Andrew's United Church, Westmount, Quebec with interment, Mount Royal Cemetery. His wife, the former Margaret Eleanor Poole survives.

At the time of his death he was chairman of Canadian Motorola Electronics Limited, which he formed in Canada 12 years ago, being president and general manager, before becoming chairman three years ago. He brought to that company many years of experience, starting with Canadian Marconi in 1919, of which he became sales manager in 1924, and assistant general manager in 1933. He left that post to go to New York, as director of station relations for National Broadcasting Company, where he remained into 1937. He then rejoined Canadian Marconi as general manager. He subsequently became chairman and president of Rogers Majestic Electronics Limited in 1945.

An interesting interlude in his industrial career came in 1950 when he was delegated to represent Canada on a NATO task force which studied defence production facilities throughout Western Europe and the United Kingdom. At that time he was on loan to the Department of Defence Production at Ottawa. He served as co-ordinator of defence production from November 1951 to May 1952, when he was

named deputy minister of defence production. He was a member of the Defence Research Board, 1955-59. During his years in the electronics industry, Mr. Brophy, in addition to giving his time in the national interest, also played an active role in association affairs.

He was a past president and director of the Radio-Electronics-Television Manufacturers Association of Canada, and was a strong figure in the Canadian Industrial Preparedness Association, being president from 1962-64, and over the years accompanying its members to the Canadian Arctic and Thule, Greenland; Cape Kennedy, and other U.S. military centres, and various NATO establishments in Europe.

Among his directorships was Canadian Overseas Telecommunications Corporation and he was also a former president of Phillips Canadian Industrial Developments Company Limited, and vice-president, B.N.A. Holdings Limited.
