## Trudeau popular - gov't. isn't

By John Roberts. M.P. YORK-SIMCOE YORK-SIMCOE Last spring I sent out a newsletter to the citizens of York-Simcoe including a list of questions. Replies have been coming into my office over the summer - in fact, they are still arriving - and we have now tabulated the results. Response is a bit down over previous questionnaires. Only about 3 percent of the 26,000 householders in York-Simcoe replied.

(1.) - DO YOU APPROVE OF THE GOVERNMENT'S USE OF THE WAR MEASURES ACT? Yes - 84.7 percent; No - 11.1 percent; Not Sure - 4.5 percent.

(2.) - IF A CLEAR MAJORITY OF THE PEOPLE OF QUEBEC WANT TO SECEDE FROM CANADA SHOULD THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT USE FORCE TO PREVENT IT? Yes - 27 percent; No - 63.3 percent; Not Sure - 9.4 percent.

(3.) - IS THE INSTITUTION OF MONARCHY A UNIFYING FORCE IN CANADA? Yes - 46.8 percent; No - 37.8 percent; Not Sure - 13.1 percent.

(4.) - DO YOU BELIEVE MORE ATTENTION SHOULD BE PAID TO THE PROBLEMS OF ONTARIO AND LESS

TO THE PROBLEMS OF QUEBEC? Yes - 47.5 percent; No - 40.8 percent; Not Sure - 8.2 percent.

(5.) - The last two questions asked whether the individual was, on the whole, satisfied with the performance of Mr. Trudeau, and with the government. Satisfied with Trudeau: Yes - 45.8 percent; No - 37.8 percent; Not Sure - 15.5 percent. Satisfied with government: Yes - 35.8 percent; No - 48.5 percent; Not Sure - 14.2 percent.

much more popular than his government. To the political observer trying to interpret these results the forecasts are cloudy. Mr. Trudeau's general 45 percent level of confidence is not greatly below the percentage vote for his party in the last election. But the 35 percent support for his government is well below the level the Liberal party received. So, if it came to a vote, would the electorate cast its vote for (or against) the leader or his government? In terms of practical voting results there is an enormous difference between the two.
