

Late Frank Underhill

# Party founder

STOUFFVILLE - One of the town's most famous citizens, Mr. Frank Underhill, died recently in Ottawa at the age of 81.

Mr. Underhill, born on O'Brien Ave., attended school in Stouffville and high school in Markham. He later went to the University of Toronto, and Oxford in England. He was a professor at the University of Toronto, and earlier at the University of Saskatchewan.

Towards the end of his life he lectured at Carleton University in Ottawa. A socialist at a time when it was actively dangerous to be one, Mr. Underhill was one of the founders of the C.C.F. The leader of the C.C.F. (which later evolved into the N.D.P.), M.J. Coldwell, was an associate of Mr. Underhill. "The Regina Manifesto", one of the party's basic documents, was written mainly by Prof. Underhill. The Manifesto has been described as "the outstanding statement of democratic aims published in the British Commonwealth". Outspoken in his opinions, the professor came close to being interned during the Second World War as a

result of his opinions concerning Canada's participation in that conflict. Some of his later opinions: "Western Ontario is the nearest approach to hell...in Canada"; "Since 1940, (Canadians) have been dependent for our security on American power".

After internal disagreements, the C.C.F.-N.D.P. and Mr. Underhill went their separate ways, and he joined the Liberals.

Mr. Underhill is survived by one sister and a niece, living near Markham.
