MARKHAM — Rev. Donald Parr, St. Andrew's United Church, conducted the service, Sept. 21, from the Dixon Funeral Home, Markham, for Milton Russell, 85, following his passing three days before, in Sunnybrook Hospital, Toronto. He had been in failing health since June.

Mr. Russell was born near Claremont, the son of David and Martha Russell. He was a motor mechanic, prior to joining the army to serve overseas.

While posted in France, he was wounded, requiring seven years of treatment. Although the injury restricted his activities in later life, he refused to give in, participating willingly in bowling tournaments and curling bonspiels.




