## Student morality quiz

STOUFFVILLE - An experimental program, to determine the moral and ethical concepts of students, is being carried out at Whitchurch-Highlands School.

Conducting the project is Dr. Clive Beck, Chairman of History and Philosophy for the Ontario Institute for Studies in Education. At a recent meeting, the York County Board of Education approved a grant to Dr. Beck in the amount of \$1,000.

The students are subjected to a quiz on various aspects of morality. Terry Gray, Principal of Whitchurch-Highlands, described a film with Dr. Beck showed the students. In this film a man, unable to afford drugs for his sick wife, stole the drugs. Students were asked how they viewed his action from a moral standpoint. Their answers were noted by Dr. Beck's secretary. Another topic discussed was racial prejudice.

Dr. Beck has been conducting his researches for more than a year, centering the studies around students in grades 5, 6 and 7. In addition to Whitchurch-Highlands, Meadowbrook and Stuart Scott Public Schools have been used.

According to Mr. Gray, Dr. Beck is hoping to compile sufficient data from his studies to draw up a course teaching ethics and morality. The course, if approved, would be placed on the curriculum of Ontario's elementary schools.
