 WHAM! He leaned into a fastball on the outside corner and

rocketed a shot to deep right-center - gone for a home run.  
 That was all - and more than Greenwood needed to wrap up their fourth league title. The score was 12-3 with Whitby on the short end.  
 Conditions were anything but good for a crucial playoff contest with a section of the field, from second base south to Audley, shrouded in a thick blanket of fog.  
 The trailing Whitby club complained but weren't convincing, not with the umpires and not with their bats. They could have 'lost' the ball with every hit out of the infield, but unfortunately (for them), they couldn't seem to see anything to hit.  
 Greenwood whirlwind hurler, Grant Pascoe was in complete command all the way. He was only touched for three safeties, and these were singles. All three Whitby runs, by Mill Rainey in the 5th; Gary Edgar in the 8th and Barry Gould in the 9th, were unearned.  
 While Greenwood's offensive wasn't that potent either, (8 hits), they bunched them together to gain an insurmountable lead.  
 Ken McTaggart and Bob Moffat led the plate attack with two each. George Wilson

slammed a triple and Art Puckrin, a double. Ken McTaggart's drive in the 1st, came with the bases loaded. Ray Peters started on the Whitby mound, yielding to George Robinson in the sixth. Robinson fared well, but the damage had been done. Both teams committed six errors.
